A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT APPROVAL OF A FIFTH AMENDMENT TO THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AND THE SAN DIEGO HOUSING COMMISSION FOR THE PROVISION OF TEMPORARY BRIDGE SHELTERS TO ADDRESS THE DUTIES OF THE PARTIES FOR OPERATION OF A BRIDGE SHELTER AT 1710 IMPERIAL AVENUE, SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA AND APPROVING ASSOCIATED FUNDING IS EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO SECTION 15061(b)(3) OF THE CEQA GUIDELINES.

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of San Diego (City Council) is considering a resolution to approve a Fifth Amendment to the Memorandum of Understanding between the City and the San Diego Housing Commission for the Provision of Temporary Bridge Shelters (Fifth Amendment) for operation of a bridge shelter at 1710 Imperial Avenue, San Diego, California, 92101, and to allocating funds from the Low-Income Lease Revenue Fund and Homeless Emergency Aid Program grant funds for expenses for that bridge shelter during Fiscal Year 2020 (Project); and

WHEREAS, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (California Public Resources Code section 21000, *et seq.*), section 21065, states that "Project" means an activity which may cause either a direct physical change in the environment, or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment; and

WHEREAS, a project is exempt from CEQA if the project is: (1) exempt by statute; (2) exempt pursuant to a categorical exemption and the application of that categorical exemption is not barred by one of the exceptions set forth in section 15300.2; or (3) the activity is covered

by the Common Sense Exemption that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, the Common Sense Exemption is applicable where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment; and


WHEREAS, the Planning Department has established that the Project is covered by the Common Sense Exemption pursuant to Guidelines section 15061(b)(3), because the Project would not, on its own accord, cause a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, on October 15, 2019, the City Council held a duly noticed public meeting and considered the written record for the amendments as well as public comment and, using its independent judgment, has determined that the Project will not have a significant effect on the environment; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego, using its independent judgment, has considered the written record and public comment for the Project, and determines that the Project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3), under the Common Sense Exemption that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk is directed to file a Notice of Exemption regarding the Project with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors for the County of San Diego.
