RESOLUTION NUMBER R-312875 DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE MAR 1 3 2020

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT THE SEWAGE TRANSPORTATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AND THE CITY OF EL CAJON IS STATUTORILY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTIONS 15301(b) AND 15061(b)(3).

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego (City) provides wastewater transportation, treatment, and disposal services for the City and 12 adjacent entities known as the Participating Agencies (PAs). The contractual conditions that are related to these services are contained in two distinct documents; and

WHEREAS, the large sewer mains, pump stations, and treatment plants that convey, treat, and dispose of the sewage for the City and the PAs are referred to collectively as the Metro System. The Metro System services provided to the PAs are governed by the terms and conditions of the Regional Wastewater Disposal Agreement (the Metro Agreement), City Document No. OO-18517, filed May 18, 1998. This agreement remains in force through December 31, 2050; and

WHEREAS, the agreement that stipulates the terms and conditions under which wastewater is transported from the City of El Cajon through the Muni System to the Metro System expired on June 1, 2001. Even though the agreement has expired, both agencies agreed to continue to operate under the expired agreement until a new agreement could be memorialized. The new Sewage Transportation Agreement (Transportation Agreement) will replace the expired agreement and it will be in effect through December 31, 2050, to run concurrent with the Metro Agreement; and

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WHEREAS, the Planning Department has established that the Agreement is categorically

exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15301(b) and that no exception to the

exemption as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 applies and an exception under

CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3); and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego has considered the potential

environmental effects of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, after having considered the written record concerning the Agreement as well

as public comment, if any, the City Council has determined based upon its independent judgment

that CEOA Guidelines section 15301(b) and CEOA Guidelines section 15300.2 cover the

Agreement; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego (City Council) determines

that the Agreement is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section

15301 (b) (existing facilities used to provide sewerage services) and under CEQA Guidelines

section 15061(b)(3).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council has determined that an exception

to the exemption as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 does not apply.
