A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT THE APPROVAL OF THE FY20 COMMUNITY PROJECTS, PROGRAMS AND SERVICES FUNDING ALLOCATIONS TO SAN DIEGO OPERA ASSOCIATION FOR CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND ST. VINCENT DE PAUL, INC. FOR JOAN KROC CENTER DRAPES ARE CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTION 15302.

WHEREAS, San Diego Opera Association is receiving grant funds through the FY20 Community Projects, Programs and Services funding allocation for Capital Equipment (Project); and

WHEREAS, St. Vincent de Paul, Inc. is receiving grant funds through the FY20 Community Projects, Programs and Services funding allocation for Joan Kroc Center Drapes; and

WHEREAS, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.), section 21084, states that the CEQA Guidelines thereto (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15000 et seq.) shall list those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and which shall be exempt from CEQA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines sections 15300-15333 list the categorical exemptions promulgated by the California Office of Planning and Research and adopted by the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency for those classes of Projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, the Development Services Department has established that the Project is

categorically Exempt from CEOA pursuant to CEOA Guidelines section 15302 (Replacement and

Reconstruction) and that no exception to the exemption, as set forth in CEQA Guidelines

section 15300.2, applies to the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego has considered the potential environmental

effects of the Project, and

WHEREAS, on May 19, 2020, the City Council held a duly noticed public meeting and

considered the written record for the Project as well as public comment; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego, using its independent judgment, has

determined that the Project will not have a significant effect on the environment because the

Project involves the normal use of existing facilities and do not involve expansion of the

facilities' normal uses; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego determines that the Project

is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15302 (Replacement

and Reconstruction) and that an exception to the exemption does not apply.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego has determined

that an exception to the exemption as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 does not

apply.
