A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT THE ADOPTION OF AN URGENCY ORDINANCE PURSUANT TO CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 65858 EXTENDING EXPIRATION DATES OF DEVELOPMENT PERMIT APPLICATIONS, BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS, AND CONSTRUCTION, DEVELOPMENT, GRADING, AND PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY PERMITS IS STATUTORILY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTIONS 15269(c) AND 15359.

WHEREAS, the adoption of an urgency Ordinance pursuant to California Government Code section 65858 extending the expiration dates of Development Permit applications, Building Permit applications, and Construction, Development, Grading, and Public Right-of-Way Permits is needed to prevent or mitigate the adverse effects to public health, safety, and welfare related to the spread of the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, by reducing delay and economic impacts on housing and other development resulting from the state of emergency related to the novel coronavirus, COVID-19 (Project); and

WHEREAS, the California State Legislature, through the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Public Resources Code sections 21000-21177, has determined that CEQA does not apply to various types of projects listed therein; and

WHEREAS, CEQA section 21084 states that the CEQA Guidelines shall list those classes of Projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and which shall be exempt from CEQA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines sections 15260-15285 list the statutory exemptions promulgated by the California State Legislature; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Department has established that the Project is statutorily exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15269(c) and 15359; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego (City Council) has considered the potential environmental effects of the Project, and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a duly noticed public meeting and considered the written record for the Project as well as any public comment; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, using its independent judgment, has determined that the Project will not have a significant effect on the environment because the Project is necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency, and is also necessary to address a sudden and unexpected occurrence involving a clear and imminent danger, demanding immediate action to prevent or mitigate the loss of, or damage to, life, health, property, or essential public services related to the novel coronavirus, COVID-19. This Ordinance will allow the City of San Diego to implement actions needed to prevent or mitigate the adverse effects to public health, safety, and welfare related to the spread of COVID-19 by reducing delay and economic impacts on housing and other development; and

WHEREAS, under Charter section 280(a)(3) this resolution is not subject to veto by the Mayor because the Project involves emergency ordinances due to the state of emergency resulting from the novel coronavirus; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Project is statutorily exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15269(c) and 15359.
