A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AND AXON ENTERPRISE, INC. FOR A BODY WORN CAMERA SYSTEM SOLUTION INCLUDING BODY WORN CAMERAS, DIGITAL EVIDENCE STORAGE, AND RELATED EQUIPMENT AND SERVICES IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$8,367,892.78 FOR A TERM OF THREE YEARS.

WHEREAS, in January 2014, the San Diego Police Department (Police Department) launched a 90-day field trial with ten patrol officers outfitted with a body worn camera (BWC) using digital storage solution developed by Axon Enterprise, Inc. (Axon), formerly named TASER International; and

WHEREAS, based on the market conditions, the equipment, evidence management software, licenses, and data storage could only be satisfied by Axon. The field trial was extended until May 12, 2014, allowing the City of San Diego (City) to configure its technology infrastructure to support Axon's digital storage solution; and

WHEREAS, in June 2014, the Police Department began the BWC project with plans to outfit and deploy BWCs to 1,000 uniformed patrol officers in all nine patrol commands; and

WHEREAS, to date about 1600 BWCs have been issued to uniformed officers, investigators, and supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the City entered into an Agreement with Axon on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. OO-20586, which expires July 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department is committed to outfitting all uniformed patrol officers with BWCs; and

WHEREAS; the use of BWCs has proven effective in reducing violent confrontations and complaints against officers. BWCs provide additional documentation of police and public encounters and are an important tool for collecting evidence and maintaining public trust; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department strives to advance the highest levels of public safety, trust, and professionalism by strengthening community partnerships through fair and impartial policing; and

WHEREAS, Axon's BWC System Solution shall be a tool to demonstrate the Police Department's commitment to transparency, ensure the accountability of its members, and increase the public's trust in officers; and

WHEREAS, on June 8, 2020, pursuant to San Diego Municipal Code section 22.3016, the Purchasing Agent certified that the award of a sole source contract is necessary and strict compliance with a competitive process would be impractical based on the incompatibility of the Police Department's technology infrastructure with a new vendor and Axon's new technology can only be provided and satisfied by Axon that offers the only system that meets the Police Department's specific requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department seeks to enter into a new Agreement with Axon for a Body System Solution including BWC, related equipment, unlimited use of digital evidence storage, full warranty of all hardware and software, complete replacement of all hardware during Year 3, licensing, configuration, implementation, training services, and ongoing maintenance support services throughout the term of the Agreement, in an amount not to exceed \$8,367,892.78 for a term of three years; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the Mayor, or his designee, is authorized to enter into an agreement, for and on behalf of the City, the Agreement

between the City and Axon Enterprise, Inc. to provide a complete BWC System Solution,

including body worn cameras, video management/storage, licensing, training, and ongoing

maintenance support services in an amount not to exceed \$8,367,892.78 over the three-year term

of the Agreement, pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement, on file with

the City Clerk as Document No. RR- 313119; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to expend

an amount not to exceed \$8,367,892.78 from the Citizens Option for Public Safety (COPS) fund

(200722) to provide a complete BWC System Solution, including body worn cameras, video

management/storage, licensing, training, and ongoing maintenance support services over the

three-year term of the Agreement, contingent upon the adoption of the Annual Appropriation

Ordinance for the applicable fiscal year and contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer

furnishing a certificate certifying that funds necessary for expenditure are, or will be, on deposit

with the City Treasurer.
