A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO APPROVING THE ALLOCATION OF \$700,000 IN CARES ACT FEDERAL FUNDING PREVIOUSLY ALLOCATED TO THE SMALL BUSINESS RELIEF FUND, REALLOCATED TO CONTRACTS FOR SPECIALIZED OUTREACH, TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE, AND GRANTS TO SMALL, AT-RISK, AND ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED BUSINESSES IMPACTED BY THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY AND APPROVING RELATED ACTIONS TO APPROPRIATE AND EXPEND THESE FUNDS.

WHEREAS, on February 19, 2020, the County Board of Supervisors ratified a declaration of local health emergency related to a novel coronavirus, SARS-CoV-2, which causes the COVID-19 disease (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom (Governor) proclaimed a State of Emergency to exist in California as a result of the threat of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Mayor Kevin Faulconer (Mayor) proclaimed the existence of a local emergency in the City of San Diego (City) as a result of COVID-19, which was ratified by the Council of the City of San Diego (Council) on March 17, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order N-33-20, ordering all residents of the State of California (State) to stay home or at their places of residence in accordance with the current State public health directives, except to get food, care for a relative or friend, obtain necessary health care or go to an essential job; and

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security

(CARES) Act was passed by the United States Congress and signed into law by President Trump

to provide emergency assistance in response to COVID-19 and its impact on the economy, public health, state and local governments, individuals, and businesses; and

WHEREAS, the CARES Act provided \$150 billion in payments to states and local governments from its Coronavirus Relief Fund (Fund) that may only be used to cover costs that:

(1) are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19; (2) were not accounted for in the budget most recently approved as of the date of enactment of the CARES Act; and (3) were incurred during the period from March 1, 2020 to December 20, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City received \$248 million (Assistance Money) from the Fund; and WHEREAS, on June 11, 2020, the Council approved Resolution R-31308, allocating up to \$12,848,365 of Assistance Money to the "Small Business Relief Fund" to be used as grants, in accordance with the CARES Act, to provide economic support to those suffering from employment or business interruptions due to COVID-19-related business closures; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of the Treasury published the "Coronavirus Relief Fund Guidance for State, Territorial, Local, and Tribal Governments" on April 22, 2020 (Guidance), and the "Coronavirus Relief Fund Frequently Asked Questions" on May 4, 2020 (FAQ), which together set forth the Department of the Treasury's interpretation of the three limitations on use of Assistance Money; and

WHEREAS, the Guidance and FAQ provide examples of eligible expenditures, which include necessary expenditures associated with the provision of economic support in connection with the public health emergency, including grants to small businesses to reimburse the costs of

business interruption caused by required closures, voluntary closures to promote social distancing measures, and decreased customer demand as a result of the COVID-19 emergency; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to identify small local businesses most vulnerable to impacts of COVID-19, including businesses that have low profit margins, rely on personal funds or external financing to fund the business, or have lower credit scores (At-Risk businesses), and to provide At-Risk businesses with economic support to addresses the continued and serious negative impacts of the COVID-19 emergency on the local economy and promote a stable business market to which business owners and employees can return once the COVID-19 emergency is abated; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to negotiate and enter agreements with one or more non-profit entities for the purpose of conducting outreach to identify and provide technical assistance to At-Risk businesses, and to offer financial assistance to eligible At-Risk businesses; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to reallocate \$700,000 of the \$12,848,365 of Assistance Money previously allocated to the Small Business Relief Fund to enter agreements for the provision of specialized outreach, technical assistance, and grants to At-Risk businesses; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego as follows:

 The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to appropriate and expend the amount of \$700,000 over Fiscal Year 2020 and Fiscal Year 2021 from the General Fund, Economic
 Development Department for the purpose of providing for specialized outreach, technical assistance, and grants to At-Risk businesses in response to the COVID-19 emergency, which funds were previously allocated from Fund 200810 - Federal Cares Act COVID-19 Relief Funds for the purpose of preventing, preparing for, and responding to the COVID-19 emergency in connection to the Small Business Relief Fund. The appropriation shall continue in force until the purpose for which it was made is accomplished or abandoned.

- 2. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to expend up to \$12,148,365 over Fiscal Year 2020 and Fiscal Year 2021 from the General Fund, Economic Development Department, for the purpose of preventing, preparing for, and responding to the COVID-19 emergency in connection to the Small Business Relief Fund, which will provide grants in accordance with the CARES Act to small businesses experiencing economic hardship due to business interruption caused by the COVID-19 emergency. The appropriation shall continue in force until the purpose for which it was made is accomplished or abandoned.
- 3. The Council finds that the expenditures authorized by this Resolution, including expenditures for the provision of specialized outreach, technical assistance, and grants to At-Risk businesses, are necessary expenditures incurred by the City due to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19.
- 4. All agreements entered pursuant to this Resolution shall require that contractor maintain and make available all documents and financial records sufficient to establish compliance with subsection 601(d) of the Social Security Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 801(d)).
