A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO CONFIRMING THE FISCAL YEAR 2022 BUDGET REPORTS FOR AND LEVYING ANNUAL ASSESSMENTS IN SPECIFIED PARKING AND BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT AREAS.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Parking and Business Improvement Area Law of 1989 and/or its predecessor law (California Streets and Highways Code sections 36500-36551) (1989 Act), the following seventeen parking and business improvement areas were established by and in the City of San Diego to annually levy and collect assessments on businesses located within the specified areas to finance certain improvements and activities within such areas (each, a 1989 Act District and collectively, 1989 Act Districts):

- Adams Avenue Business Improvement District (Ordinances O-16479; O-18087;
 O-19749);
- 2. City Heights Business Improvement District (Ordinance O-16918);
- 3. College Area Business Improvement District (Ordinances O-18263; O-18539);
- 4. Diamond Business Improvement District (Ordinances O-18262; O-18540);
- 5. East Village Business Improvement District (Ordinance O-19881);
- 6. El Cajon Business Improvement District (Ordinance O-16480);
- 7. El Cajon Boulevard Business Improvement District (Ordinance O-16919);
- 8. Gaslamp Quarter Business Improvement District (Ordinances O-15647; O-17664)
- 9. Hillcrest Business Improvement District (Ordinances O-16230; O-17340);

- 10. La Jolla Business Improvement District (Ordinances O-17458; O-17803);
- 11. Little Italy Business Improvement District (Ordinances O-18374; O-18541);
- 12. Mission Hills Business Improvement District (Ordinance O-17229);
- 13. North Park Business Improvement District (Ordinances O-16481; O-19780);
- 14. Ocean Beach Business Improvement District (Ordinance O-17248);
- 15. Old Town Business Improvement District (Ordinance O-18208);
- Pacific Beach Business Improvement District (Ordinances O-18373; O-18542);

- 17. San Ysidro Business Improvement District (Ordinance O-18612); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Parking and Business Improvement Area Law of 1965 (California Streets and Highways Code sections 36000-36081), that certain parking and business improvement area named the "Downtown Improvement Area" (Downtown District) was established by and in the City of San Diego (Ordinances O-10450; O-10774) to annually levy and collect assessments on businesses located within the specified area to finance certain improvements and activities within such area (the 1989 Act Districts and the Downtown District are sometimes each, individually, referred to in this Resolution as a District and, collectively, as the Districts); and

WHEREAS, the Council intends to continue the improvements and activities undertaken by each of the Districts; and

WHEREAS, as required by California Streets and Highways Code section 36533, the respective advisory board for each 1989 Act District submitted an annual report (Budget Report)

to the Council covering the time period commencing on July 1, 2021, and continuing through and including June 30, 2022 (Fiscal Year 2022); and

WHEREAS, the advisory board for the Downtown District submitted an annual Budget Report to the Council for Fiscal Year 2022; and

WHEREAS, on April 26, 2021, the Council adopted Resolution R-313503, approving the Fiscal Year 2022 Budget Reports for each District; and

WHEREAS, on May 18, 2021, the Council conducted a public hearing, in accordance with California Streets and Highways Code section 36534(a)(6), and received public testimony and evidence regarding the levy of the proposed assessment in each 1989 Act District for Fiscal Year 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City traditionally enters into a District management agreement with the business or merchants association (Association) appointed by the Council as the advisory body for each respective District for each respective Association to manage the daily operations of its District; and

WHEREAS, effective May 22, 2018, the Council adopted Resolution No. R-311760, approving District management agreements with each Association, to be effective July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019, with four (4) individual Fiscal Year extensions available, and approval of each individual Fiscal Year extension by the Council; and

WHEREAS, the existing extension is set to expire on June 30, 2021 and two (2) individual Fiscal Year extensions remain in the existing District management agreements between the City and each respective Association appointed by the Council; and

WHEREAS, in response to concerns with accountability and transparency in the management of the Districts, the Council desires to amend the management agreements with each Association to add provisions requiring an annual review of the Association bylaws, an anti-harassment and inclusivity workplace policy signed by all Association directors and employees, and annual anti-harassment and inclusivity workplace training for all Association directors and employees (Accountability Provisions), as well as to amend the next Fiscal Year extension to six (6) months, with a six (6) month renewal subject to compliance with the Accountability Provisions as determined by Economic Development Department Staff; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

1. The Fiscal Year 2022 Budget Report for each District, including a description of the specific District, the boundaries of the District and any benefit zones within the District, the proposed assessments to be levied upon businesses within the District, and the improvements and activities to be undertaken within the District during Fiscal Year 2022, is confirmed, as on file at the Office of the City Clerk with reference to the following document numbers:

- 2. The adoption of this Resolution constitutes the continued levy of assessments on businesses located within each 1989 Act District during Fiscal Year 2022, to finance the improvements and activities set forth in the respective Fiscal Year 2022 Budget Report for each 1989 Act District.
- 3. The adoption of this Resolution confirms the continued levy of assessments on businesses located within the Downtown District during Fiscal Year 2022, to finance the improvements and activities set forth in the Fiscal Year 2022 Budget Report for the Downtown District.
- 4. The City's Chief Financial Officer or designee is authorized to appropriate, transfer, and expend assessment revenues within each District's fund for administration and operation of that

District in accordance with the approved Fiscal Year 2022 Budget Report for that District, including the "Fund Balance" and "Interest Fund Balance" from Fiscal Year 2021 at year end and the anticipated District assessments to be collected in Fiscal Year 2022, contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer certifying that funds are available.

- 5. The third amendment to each Fiscal Year 2019 District management agreement (each, a Third Amendment) with each respective Association appointed by the Council as the advisory body for each District for management of daily District operations is approved, with the Accountability Provisions and a six (6) month extension, with a six (6) month renewal subject to compliance with the Accountability Provisions as determined by Economic Development Department Staff.
- 6. The Mayor or designee is authorized but not directed to sign, on the City's behalf, each Third Amendment and any and all documents necessary and appropriate to implement each Third Amendment. A copy of each Third Amendment, when signed by the representatives of the City and the respective Association and approved by the City Attorney, shall be placed on file with the City Clerk as follows:
