A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO RECONSIDERING THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE STATE OF EMERGENCY RELATED TO COVID-19 AND MAKING FINDINGS TO CONTINUE TELECONFERENCING PUBLIC MEETINGS PURSUANT TO THE RALPH M. BROWN ACT.

WHEREAS, a novel coronavirus, COVID-19, causes infectious disease and was first detected in other countries in December 2019; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 symptoms include fever, cough, and shortness of breath, and those who have been afflicted have experienced anything from mild illness to death; and

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention considers COVID-19 to be a very serious public health threat, and the World Health Organization declared the COVID-19 outbreak to be a global pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on February 19, 2020, the County Board of Supervisors ratified a declaration of local health emergency related to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed a state of emergency in California as a result of the threat of COVID-19 that remains in effect today; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Executive Orders N-25-20 and N-29-20, issued on March 12, 2020 and March 17, 2020, respectively, suspended provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act (Brown Act) related to teleconferencing of meetings, permitting local jurisdictions to hold public meetings via teleconferencing and allowing members of the public to observe and address the meeting telephonically or otherwise electronically; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Executive Orders N-08-21 and N-15-21, issued on June 11, 2021 and September 20, 2021, respectively, extended the suspension of the Brown Act provisions through September 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2021, the Governor signed Assembly Bill 361 which provides that a local agency may use revised teleconferencing rules in California Government Code section 54953(e) if the legislative body makes certain findings reconsidering the circumstances of the state of emergency and those findings are reconsidered every 30 days; and

WHEREAS, at the City of San Diego COVID-19 Response and Recovery Committee meeting on September 20, 2021, County Public Health Officials told the Committee members that they anticipate a fifth wave of COVID-19 cases this winter, especially among people who are unvaccinated; and

WHEREAS, the California Occupational Safety and Health Standards Board adopted California Code of Regulations, title 8, section 3205, which states, "particles containing the virus can travel more than six feet, especially indoors, so physical distancing, face coverings, increased ventilation indoors, and respiratory protection decrease the spread of COVID-19, but are most effective when used in combination"; and

WHEREAS, on September 23, 2021, the County of San Diego's Public Health Official, Dr. Wilma Wooten, issued a letter recommending the utilization of teleconferencing options for public meetings as an effective and recommended social distancing measure to facilitate participation in public affairs and encourage participants to protect themselves and others from the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, on December 7, 2021, the County Public Health Officer, Dr. Wilma Wooten reported to the County Board of Supervisors that "the County is still seeing increased COVID-19 cases due to the delta variant"; and

WHEREAS, according to the CDC Levels of Transmission, California's level of transmission of COVID-19 is "high transmission" with San Diego's level determined to also be "high transmission;" and

WHEREAS, on January 5, 2022, Governor Gavin Newsom signed Executive Order N-1-22 extending the ability for the State legislature and local school boards to meet virtually stating that the statewide seven-day average case rate has increased by 805 percent, the number of COVID-19 hospitalized patients has increased by 154 percent, and the surge is being driven by the recent emergence of the Omicron variant, which has recently been estimated to account for approximately 70 percent of cases sequenced nationally; and

WHEREAS, early data suggest that the Omicron variant is more transmissible than the Delta variant; and

WHEREAS, according to the County of San Diego COVID-19 Watch – Weekly Coronavirus Surveillance Report, during the week of December 19, 2021 through December 25, 2021, there were 12,170 cases and 36 deaths and during the week of December 26, 2021 through January 1, 2022, there were 29,536 cases and 27 deaths; and

WHEREAS, the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the City Council members to meet safely in person; and

WHEREAS, the public health and safety of attendees at public hearings in the City is of the utmost importance; and

WHEREAS, under San Diego Charter section 280(a)(1), this resolution is not subject to veto by the Mayor because this matter is exclusively within the purview of the City Council and not affecting the administrative service of the City under the control of the Mayor; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, and also sitting as the

legislative body of the Housing Authority of the City of San Diego and of the Public Facilities

Financing Authority, as follows:

1. That the recitals set forth above are true and correct and form the basis for the

findings of this Resolution.

2. That the Council finds that there is an existing proclaimed state of emergency and the

state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members to meet safely

in person.

3. That to the extent legally permissible, this finding applies to all boards, commissions,

and committees of the City of San Diego, including those established by the City

Council or where the City Council sits as the legislative body of the applicable entity

and are subject to the Brown Act, and further to all City boards, commissions, and

committees created under the City Charter and those that comply with the Brown Act

under direction from the City Council.
