A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DECLARING SUPPORT FOR REP. SARA JACOBS' "MY BODY, MY DATA" ACT TO PROTECT THE PRIVACY, DATA, AND SAFETY OF PEOPLE SEEKING REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH CARE.

WHEREAS, even before the Supreme Court decision regarding *Roe v. Wade* was issued, the City of San Diego was engaged with reproductive justice advocates, working to uphold everyone's equality and liberty by protecting patients seeking abortion access and reproductive freedom; and

WHEREAS, on May 24, 2022, the Council of the City of San Diego was the first city in the nation to pass a resolution declaring San Diego a "safe city for reproductive freedom and access to abortion;" and

WHEREAS, on June 16, 2022, Rep. Sara Jacobs introduced the "My Body, My Data Act," which will protect the privacy, data, and safety of patients seeking reproductive health care; and

WHEREAS, fear and privacy concerns should never stand in the way of patients accessing health care, including people seeking reproductive health care or access to abortion; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego supports protecting people who use fertility, menstruation, or period-tracking apps, as well as any patient seeking information about reproductive products or services; and

WHEREAS, data privacy is an important part of reproductive justice and the

City of San Diego wants to stop information such as personal health data related to pregnancy,

menstruation, basal body temperature, termination of pregnancy, contraception, surgery, or

diagnoses from being used by anyone, including prosecutors or private actors under other states'

anti-abortion laws; and

WHEREAS, today's action demonstrates the City of San Diego's strong support for the

"My Body, My Data Act;" NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego declares strong support for

legislation to protect the privacy and data of people seeking reproductive health care.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Government Affairs is directed

to amend the 2022 Legislative Platform with the following language: "Support measures that

protect and augment reproductive healthcare rights, including those that protect data and privacy

of patients, and oppose measures that limit availability of those healthcare options."
