ORDINANCE NUMBER O- 21532 (NEW SERIES) DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE JAN 1 3 2023

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 9, ARTICLE 8, DIVISION 3 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 98.0301, RELATING TO QUALIFICATIONS OF THE SAN DIEGO HOUSING COMMISSION BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS, on November 4, 2021, the Independent Budget Analyst issued IBA Report 21-25 titled "Comparative Analysis of Housing Authority Structures in California" containing, among other things, a comparative review of the required expertise for other housing authorities' boards; and

WHEREAS, on February 15, 2022, the Council of the City of San Diego (Council) established a temporary standing committee, called the Select Committee on San Diego Housing Commission Oversight and Reform, to provide oversight and consider reforms to the governance and structure of the San Diego Housing Commission (Housing Commission); and

WHEREAS, on July 25, 2022, the Select Committee on San Diego Housing Commission Oversight and Reform voted to initiate amendments to the San Diego Municipal Code to establish minimum qualifications for members appointed to serve on the Housing Commission Board of Commissioners, excluding tenant commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Attorney has drafted this Ordinance based on the information provided by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 9, Article 8, Division 3 of the San Diego Municipal Code is amended by amending section 98.0301 as follows:

Article 8: Housing

Division 3: San Diego Housing Commission and Relocation Appeals Board

§ 98.0301 San Diego Housing Commission

(a) through (e) [No change in text.]

- (f) Appointment of Members. The Board of Commissioners shall consist of seven members who shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to City Council confirmation.
 - (1) [No change in text.]
 - (2) Each member, except the two members appointed pursuant to section 98.0301(f)(1), shall have at least five years of experience in one or more of the following areas: real estate finance, affordable housing, homelessness, workforce development, healthcare, nonprofit, education, or community-based organizations.
 City Council may make an exception to this requirement when a person with unique qualifications, but without the required experience, is available to serve as a *member*. When nominating a person who does not have the required experience, the Mayor shall provide information to City Council regarding the nominee's unique qualifications to be a *member*.
 - (3) The term of office of each *member* shall be four years, except that the terms of office of the two *members* appointed pursuant to section 98.0301(f)(1) shall be two years as set forth in California

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Health and Safety Code section 34272. A *member* shall hold office until the *member*'s successor has been appointed and confirmed.

- (4) Vacancies occurring during a term shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment made by the Mayor subject to City Council confirmation. Whenever the Mayor does not appoint a *member* within 45 days after a vacancy occurs, the Council shall make such appointment.
- (5) Each member shall receive as compensation the sum of \$50 for each meeting of the Board of Commissioners attended, provided that the total compensation for each member shall not exceed \$100 in any one month. In addition, each member shall receive necessary travel and incidental expenses related to member duties. Any member may waive compensation by filing a written waiver of compensation form with the Commission President.
- (6) For inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct in office, a*member* may be removed by majority vote of the City Council.

(g) through (h) [No change in text.]

Section 2. That a full reading of this Ordinance is dispensed with prior to passage, a written copy having been made available to the Council and the public prior to the day of its passage.

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Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from

and after its final passage.
