AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF THE FOURTH AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT WITH BENTLEY SYSTEMS, INC. FOR COMPUTER AIDED DRAFTING DESIGN (CADD) APPLICATION SERVICES AND RELATED ACTIONS.

WHEREAS, on July 1, 2017, the City of San Diego (City) entered into a five-year agreement with Bentley Systems, Incorporated (Bentley) for Computer Aided Drafting Design (CADD) application services (Agreement) which is utilized citywide in implementing the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP); and

WHEREAS, Bentley Systems – MicroStation application tool is currently being used by various City Departments, including the Engineering & Capital Projects (E&CP) Department, to create detailed engineering plans and drawings for construction projects; and

WHEREAS, the enterprise license subscription, ProjectWise cloud environment, and related maintenance & support services are managed by E&CP and the costs are allocated based on the number of active licenses between E&CP, Transportation, Environmental Services, Storm Water and the Public Utilities Departments; and

WHEREAS, the E&CP Department has over 225 CADD users of its 675+ engineering position classifications that are dependent on the applications/workflows for planning, design, and construction of CIP projects.; and

WHEREAS, the City and Bentley have previously entered into three contract amendments to extend the duration and increase the not to exceed amount of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City and Bentley have negotiated a Fourth Amendment to the Agreement with Bentley to extend the term of the Agreement for one additional year to June 30, 2024, in a total amount not to exceed \$1,103,482 with \$876,169 to Bentley for CADD software in Fiscal Year 2024 and an additional \$227,313 for anticipated as-needed software support and instructor-led training (Fourth Amendment); and

WHEREAS, the Fourth Amendment is needed to ensure that the City has access to uninterrupted CADD software services while the City completes the Request for Proposal process for a new long-term contract; and

WHEREAS, under Charter Section 99, no contract, agreement, or obligation extending for a period of more than five years may be authorized except by ordinance approved by a two-thirds majority vote of City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Attorney has drafted this ordinance based on the information provided by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. The Fourth Amendment to Bentley Systems, Incorporated contract with the City of San Diego to extend the duration one year to June 30, 2024 and increase the funding amount not to exceed \$1,103,482, under the terms and conditions set forth in the Fourth Amendment to the Agreement on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. OO 21643 is approved.

Section 2. The Mayor, or designee, is authorized to sign and deliver the Fourth Amendment.

Section 3. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to expend an amount not to exceed \$1,103,482 with \$876,169 to Bentley for CADD software in Fiscal Year 2024; \$14,248.81 from Fund No. 700000, Muni Sewer Revenue Fund; \$18,585.40 from Fund No. 700001, Metro Sewer Utility Fund; \$29,117.13 from Fund No. 700011, Water Utility Operating Fund; \$23,600.51 from Fund No. 700039, Refuse Disposal Enterprise Fund; \$663,764.39 from Fund No. 720057, Engineering & Capital Projects Fund; \$23,600.51 from Fund No. 100000, General Fund, Business Area 2114, Storm Water Department; and \$103,252.24 from Fund No. 100000, General Fund, Business Area 2116, Transportation Department; and an additional \$227,313 over one year for anticipated as-needed software support and instructor-led training; and

Section 4. That a full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to passage, a written copy having been made available to the Council and the public prior to the day of its passage.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.
