AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO EXEMPTING A PROGRAM MANAGER AND TWO PROGRAM COORDINATOR POSITIONS IN THE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT FROM THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE.

WHEREAS, on June 1, 2023, the Civil Service Commission of the City of San Diego (City) reviewed a request from the Transportation Department (Department) to exempt a Program Manager and two Program Coordinator positions from the Classified Service; and

WHEREAS, the Program Manager position will oversee and manage the claims and litigation process for the Department; manage the intake of all claims and litigation received by the Department; represent the Department in trial and testify when required; liaison with the Office of the City Attorney and other City departments; ensure remediation actions are taken; and develop and update safety and training policies and procedures for litigation outcomes; and

WHEREAS, one Program Coordinator position will oversee the Air Pollution Control District settlement program that mandates tree planning, maintenance, and reporting; design, implement, and manage the program; negotiate and execute new contracts; determine new opportunities for tree planting in communities of concern and create tree wells to expand tree canopy in built-out environments; and develop policies on determining areas for tree planting and processes for tree planting and equity distribution; and

WHEREAS, one Program Coordinator position will oversee the Data and Analytics and Quality Assurance/Compliance sections of the Utilities Undergrounding Program; administer the Underground Utilities Procedural Ordinance and electrical franchise grantee obligations; consult with utility companies to establish mandatory timelines for the underground conversion of poles

and overhead wires and enforce mandates; recommend where to invest funds for undergrounding projects in accordance with Council Policy 600-08, the Utilities Undergrounding Master Plan, and Undergrounding MOU; develop policies on how to prioritize spending funds; and develop processes for undergrounding projects; and

WHEREAS, San Diego City Charter (Charter) section 117 states the Unclassified Service shall include "[m]anagerial employees having significant responsibilities for formulating or administering departmental policies and programs. Each such position shall be exempted from the Classified Service by ordinance, upon the initiation of the appropriate appointing authority and after receiving the advisory review and comment of the Civil Service Commission and the approval of the City Council"; and

WHEREAS, upon review of the duties and responsibilities of the positions, as described by the Department, the Civil Service Commission found they meet the intent of Charter section 117 to exempt the positions from the Classified Service; and

WHEREAS, the finding by the Civil Service Commission is set forth in the memorandum dated June 2, 2023, to the Honorable Council President and members of the City Council (Council), prepared on behalf of the Civil Service Commission by the Personnel Director, on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. OO-______21697; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Attorney has drafted this ordinance based on the information provided by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That pursuant to Charter section 117, the Council exempts from the Classified Service the Program Manager and two Program Coordinator positions in the Department whose

duties and responsibilities were reviewed by the Civil Service Commission, as described in the memorandum on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. OO- 21697.

Section 2. That a full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to passage, a written copy having been made available to the Council and the public prior to the day of its passage.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.
