AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO APPROVING THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT WITH THE LAW FIRM OF MULLEN AND PLUMMER APC TO PROVIDE CONTINUED AS-NEEDED LEGAL SERVICES AS PANEL OUTSIDE COUNSEL.

WHEREAS, in November 2017 and February 2018, the City of San Diego (City) issued Requests for Proposals (RFPs), seeking to retain panel outside counsel in seven areas of law on an as-needed basis, in order to streamline the process for engaging outside counsel, to avoid delays in City projects moving forward and putting the City at a disadvantage in litigation; and

WHEREAS, on July 20, 2018, by San Diego Resolution R-311866 (July 20, 2018), the City Council (Council) approved the retention of 17 different law firms to represent the City on an as-needed basis in these seven areas of law, including the law firm of Mullen and Plummer APC (Law Firm) to represent the City in the area of "Workers' Compensation"; and

WHEREAS, the Legal Services Agreement awarded to the Law Firm was in an amount not to exceed \$250,000; and

WHEREAS, the Law Firm will soon exceed the maximum contract time limit of fiveyears, with its term presently set to end on August 9, 2023; and

WHEREAS the City Attorney's Office proposed First Amendment to extend the term of the Contract by an additional two (2) years is necessary to allow continuity of representation in various legal matters and the Law Firm to continue the representation of the City in in the trial proceedings and potential appeals of a pending workers compensation case because the City Attorney's Office has a conflict of interest in the matter; and

WHEREAS, an increase of two-years, which would raise the total contract time to sevenyears, is necessary to avoid a disruption in the Law Firm's services that would impede the current work that the Law Firm is performing; and

WHEREAS, the Council must approve the First Amendment to the Contract in accordance with San Diego Charter section 99 because the term of the extended Contract will exceed five years; NOW, THEREFORE;

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the Council approves and authorizes the Mayor or his designee to execute the First Amendment to the Contract with the Law Firm, to extend the contract term through August 9, 2025 and to continue uninterrupted payment of invoices in the previously authorized total amount not to exceed \$250,000.
