AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF THE THIRD AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT WITH TABLET COMMAND, INC. FOR EMERGENCY INCIDENT MANAGEMENT APPLICATION SERVICES.

WHEREAS, on November 14, 2019, the City of San Diego executed a sole-source agreement with Tablet Command, Inc. (Tablet Command) for emergency incident management application services (Agreement); and

WHEREAS, Tablet Command provides a software application integrated with the City of San Diego Fire-Rescue Department's (Fire-Rescue) 9-1-1 Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD) system; and

WHEREAS, the Tablet Command software provides a web application and an application for mobile devices; and

WHEREAS, on a regular basis, the software supports situational awareness by displaying a list of active emergency incidents and providing users with push notifications; and

WHEREAS, the City's primary ambulance transport provider, Falck Mobile Health, also has access to the software; and

WHEREAS, licenses for Tablet Command software have been extended to San Diego

Park Rangers for situational awareness of medical aids and/or emergencies in their jurisdictions;

and

WHEREAS, during large-scale emergency or disaster response, the software assists the Incident Commander in tracking and managing the assignment of emergency resources; and

WHEREAS, the software system is integrated with Fire-Rescue's staffing system so that crew names are associated with their units (i.e., the Incident Commander can account for crews on scene); and

WHEREAS, since the initial deployment of this software application, all agencies in the MetroZone have adopted its usage and it has proven to be very beneficial as a shared platform for incidents with muti-agency response; and

WHEREAS, as the dispatching services provider for the Chula Vista, Coronado, Imperial Beach, National City and Poway fire departments, the City procures the Tablet Command licenses for these agencies through its account and is reimbursed by these partner agencies based on their actual usage; and

WHEREAS, Fire-Rescue seeks to extend the term of this Agreement to June 30, 2028, and increase the Agreement amount by \$555,000 for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$858,000; and

WHEREAS, on April 24, 2023, the Purchasing and Contracting Director approved a modified Sole Source Request for the Agreement with Tablet Command; and

WHEREAS, under San Diego Charter section 99, no contract, agreement, or obligation extending for a period of more than five years may be authorized except by Ordinance approved by two-thirds majority vote of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Attorney has drafted this ordinance based on the information provided by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor, or his designee, is authorized to execute a third amendment to the Agreement between the City of San Diego and Tablet Command for emergency incident

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management application services, as set forth in the Third Amendment on file with the City

Clerk as OO - **21727**.

Section 2. That the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to appropriate and expend

\$111,000 in Fiscal Year 2024 and \$111,000 in each subsequent Fiscal Year 2025 to 2028 to

increase the total not-to-exceed amount to \$858,150 over the full term of the Agreement, from

the General Fund (100000) Fire-Rescue Department (1912), for the purposes of obtaining

licenses and as-needed services from Tablet Command related to emergency incident

management, contingent upon the adoption of the Annual Appropriation Ordinance for the

applicable fiscal year, and contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer first furnishing one or

more certificates certifying that funds necessary for expenditure are, or will be, on deposit with

the City Treasurer.

Section 3. That a full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to passage, a

written copy having been made available to the Council and the public prior to the day of its

passage.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from

and after its final passage.
