AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 4, DIVISION 5 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING NEW SECTION 64.0521 RELATING TO AN ELECTRONIC TRANSACTION AND REPORTING SYSTEM FOR THE INDUSTRIAL WASTEWATER CONTROL PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, all industrial wastewater discharge into the City of San Diego's wastewater system requires the issuance of a permit and mandates reporting of all discharges to comply with local, state, and federal laws and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Department's Industrial Wastewater Control Program (IWCP) reviews and submits all discharge reports to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA); and

WHEREAS, the IWCP identified electronic reporting as a secure and efficient alternative to paper submittals, reducing the chance for human error and saving employee time; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to implement an electronic transaction and reporting system in compliance with the EPA's Cross-Media Electronic Reporting Rule (CROMERR), which establishes a framework under which the EPA will accept electronic reports from regulated entities, provided that the electronic submittals have the same level of legal enforceability as paper submittals; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Attorney has drafted this Ordinance based on the information provided by City staff, including information provided by the EPA and verified by City Staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 6, Article 4, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code is amended by adding new section 64.0521, to read as follows:

## §64.0521 Industrial Users Electronic Reporting Compliance

- (a) The City may use electronic transmission, including electronic signatures, to send, receive, and enforce industrial wastewater discharge reports and other documents, provided that the City Manager develops policies and procedures that include the following:
  - (1) A method to verify all reports, permits, and signatures are authentic:
  - (2) A method to certify all signatures and electronic submissions are enforceable under penalty of civil and criminal code;
  - (3) A method to ensure that electronic documents cannot be altered after they are signed, including in transmission and after receipt;
  - (4) A method to ensure that any individual signatory is authorized to electronically sign on behalf of permit holders; and
  - (5) A method to ensure that any reports or documents that the City is required to submit to the EPA comply with the submission requirements in 40 C.F.R. 3 Subpart B, as may be amended.
- (b) Any person submitting discharge reports or other documentation to the City by electronic transmission shall certify the authenticity of their signature and ability to sign for the permit holder through a subscriber agreement.

Section 2. That a full reading of this Ordinance is dispensed with prior to passage, a

written copy having been made available to the Council and the public prior to the day of its

passage.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day

from and after its final passage.
