A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ACCEPT GRANT FUNDING RELATED TO ITS PARTICIPATION IN THE NATIONAL URBAN SEARCH AND RESCUE RESPONSE SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Federal Emergency

Management Agency's (FEMA) urban Search and Rescue System is made up of twenty-eight
task forces across the United States; and

WHEREAS, the City's Fire-Rescue Department is the sponsoring agency for the California Task Force Eight (CA-TF-8); and

WHEREAS, CA-TF-8 is capable of deploying a seventy-person team within four hours to respond to natural or man-made disasters anywhere in the United States; and

WHEREAS, CA-TF-8 is trained and equipped to perform rescues from floods and collapsed buildings; and

WHEREAS, program costs include one Battalion Chief and one Management Analyst; and

WHEREAS, since the creation of this program in 1992, program management costs as well as supply, equipment, and maintenance costs, have been funded by continuing grants provided through cooperative agreements with DHS and FEMA; and

WHEREAS, in the event of activation, the personnel and non-personnel costs resulting from CA-TF-8 deployment are reimbursed to the City by DHS and FEMA via a claim reimbursement process, distinct from the grant program; and

WHEREAS, the City will receive yearly grants and cooperative agreements relating to CA-TF-8 starting in November 2022; and

WHEREAS, there are no matching fund requirements and there is no impact to the City's General Fund; and

WHEREAS, these grants are reimbursable in nature and require the City to spend funds prior to requesting reimbursement;

WHEREAS, expenditures will be initially sourced from the City's General Fund via a special grant fund and then reimbursed from DHS and FEMA;

WHEREAS, application, acceptance, and expenditure of grant funding shall be contingent upon approval by the Grants Review Team for each grant in each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, approval by the City Council is required by San Diego Municipal Code section 22.5204(b)(1),(5);

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Attorney has drafted this resolution based on the information provided by City staff with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the Mayor or his designee is authorized to apply for and take all necessary actions to secure funding for California Task Force 8 though grant funds for Fiscal Years 2023-2027, including any amendments, extensions, or renewals of the grants.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to establish special accounts and to accept, appropriate, and expend grant funding for each grant awarded for California Task Force 8 in Fiscal Years 2023-2027, contingent on the execution of all required grant documents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor, or his designee, is authorized to enter into all agreements and certifications necessary for the purpose of implementing the California Task Force 8 Grant Program in Fiscal Years 2023-2027.
