A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DESIGNATING THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AS A BEE CITY USA AFFILIATE AND SUPPORTING THE CREATION OF A BEE CITY USA PROGRAM COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, pollinators such as bees, butterflies, beetles, and other insects are responsible for pollinating three-fourths of the world's flowering plants and approximately 35 percent of the world's food crops; and

WHEREAS, bees and other pollinators have experienced population declines due to a combination of habitat loss, disease, parasites, poor nutrition, climate change, and environmental contaminants such as pesticides, including insecticides, fungicides, and herbicides; and

WHEREAS, the Xerces Society for Invertebrate Conservation is an international nonprofit organization that protects the natural world through the conservation of invertebrates and their habitats; and

WHEREAS, the Xerces Society's Pollinator Conservation Program aims to recruit cities to join in declaring themselves to be Bee City USA affiliates to galvanize communities to sustain pollinators by increasing the abundance of native plants, providing nest sites, and reducing the use of pesticides; and

WHEREAS, pollinator-friendly communities can benefit the local and regional economies through healthier ecosystems, increased vegetable and fruit crop yields, and increased demand for pollinator-friendly plant materials from local growers; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego (City) supports the creation of a Bee City USA program committee through a partnership with a local non-profit organization and the City's designation as a Bee City USA community from the Xerces Society, which will foster broad-

based community engagement in environmental awareness and sustainability as well as support and encourage healthy pollinator habitat creation, maintenance, and enhancement; and

WHEREAS, the City has previously enacted policies and initiatives to preserve local habitat and open space, to protect wildlife, and to improve the quality of life for its citizens and visitors, and should be certified by the Xerces Society as a Bee City USA community; and

WHEREAS, the City has enacted the Biodiverse SD Program, which includes the City's Multiple Species Conservation Program, to protect endangered species unique to San Diego and to protect the region's biodiversity; and

WHEREAS, the City has utilized integrated pest management (IPM) practices since 1999, which trains employees to maintain healthy landscapes and facilities that minimize risks to people and environment by identifying and removing the cause of pest problems rather than simply attacking the symptoms, and employs pests' natural enemies along with cultural, mechanical, and physical controls when prevention is not enough, and uses pesticides only when no other method is feasible or effective; and

WHEREAS, the City's Parks Master Plan, adopted in August 2021, calls for the increased use of native plants, shrubs, and trees in City parks and developments; and

WHEREAS, since 2021, Mayor Todd Gloria has taken the National Wildlife Federation's Mayor Monarch Pledge to help save the monarch butterfly by committing to create habitat for the monarch butterfly and other pollinators, and to educate residents on how they can make a difference at home and in their community; and

WHEREAS, the City created the Resiliency Advisory Board to serve as an advisory body to the Mayor and the City Council on natural resource conservation, climate resiliency and

adaption, wetlands, habitat preservation, biodiversity, and the Climate Resilient SD Plan, and to

assist the City in attaining its stated goals in these areas; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Attorney has drafted this resolution based on the

information provided by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true,

and accurate; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the City of San Diego

is hereby designated as the Bee City USA sponsor.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of San Diego designates the Office of

Councilmember Joe LaCava, as the Bee City USA Liaison.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of San Diego assigned and authorizes the

Resiliency Advisory Board to facilitate the City's participation in the Bee City USA program,

and to take necessary actions as required by the program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Resiliency Advisory Board will advise on the

execution of the Bee City USA requirements until a recognized Bee City USA program

committee is established.
