A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DECLARING A CONTINUED STATE OF EMERGENCY REGARDING RAW SEWAGE, SOLID WASTE, AND SEDIMENT COMING FROM TIJUANA, MEXICO.

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8630 authorizes local governing bodies to proclaim local emergencies when such events occur as are described in California Government Code section 8558(c); and

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8630 further provides that the local governing body review the need for continuing the local emergency at least once every 60 days until the governing body terminates the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego adopted San Diego Resolution R-282544 on September 7, 1993, declaring the existence of a state of emergency regarding the escalated discharge of raw sewage across the international border into the City from Tijuana, Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego adopted San Diego Resolution R-312652 on September 10, 2019, declaring the existence of a state of emergency regarding solid waste and sediment flowing across the international border with Mexico via the Tijuana River and other waterways, into the City of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, raw sewage, solid waste, and sediment flowing across the international border continues to pose the possibility of peril to persons and property in the City of San Diego; and

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that pursuant to California

Government Code section 8630, a continued state of emergency is declared to persist due to raw

sewage, solid waste, and sediment coming from Tijuana, Mexico.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the measures previously taken by the Council of the

City of San Diego in Resolutions R-282544 and R-312652 shall continue to have full force and

effect.
