AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 3, DIVISION 46 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 33.4602, 33.4604, 33.4605, 33.4608, 33.4609, 33.4610, 33.4612, 33.4613, 33.4618, 33.4619, 33.4620, 33.4621, 33.4622, 33.4623, AND 33.4624; AND AMENDING CHAPTER 8, ARTICLE 3, DIVISION 1 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 83.0101, 83.0102, 83.0104, 83.0105, 83.0106, AND 83.0107, ALL RELATING TO PEDICABS.

<u>RECITALS</u>

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Ordinance based on the following:

A. Pedicabs are a popular form of transportation in the City of San Diego (City).

B. The City has regulated pedicabs since 2000 to protect the health, safety, and

welfare of the public and passengers who use pedicabs as a form of transportation.

C. The pedicab industry and the City's Municipal Code regulations have developed

over time and have been amended several times in response to changes in the law or the industry.

D. Most pedicab operators are independent contractors who lease pedicabs from

pedicab owners.

E. Pedicab owners must obtain a pedicab decal that determines in which areas of the City the pedicab may be operated.

F. Pedicab operators must obtain a pedicab operating permit.

G. Pedicab owners and operators must comply with various permit, equipment, and operating conditions.

H. The City has received hundreds of complaints from residents, businesses, and visitors regarding excessive noise from pedicabs equipped with sound amplification equipment, with noise often continuing until 2:00 a.m.

I. In 2023, the San Diego Unified Port District (Port) amended its pedicab regulations to prohibit use of sound amplification devices while operating a pedicab.

J. In addition to noise complaints, the City has received numerous complaints regarding fraudulent or deceptive fare practices resulting in passengers incurring unexpected costs.

K. To addresses these concerns, the City Council wishes to amend the pedicab regulations to define what it means to operate a pedicab, prohibit amplified sound, require a written invoice with the full pedicab fare prior to departure, strengthen the fare signage and pedicab marking requirements, increase the responsibility of pedicab owners by requiring them to sign the Code of Conduct for City of San Diego Pedicab Owners and Operators (Code of Conduct) and name the City of San Diego as an additional insured on their insurance policies, and making a violation of the Municipal Code or Code of Conduct grounds for administrative action against the owner or operator regarding the pedicab decal or operating permit.

L. The amendments will enhance public health, safety, and welfare, and achieve consistency with the Port regulations regarding amplified sound, making compliance easier for pedicab owners and operators.

M. The Office of the City Attorney has drafted this Ordinance based on the information provided by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate.

§33.4604 Police Permit Required for Pedicab Operator

- (a) It is unlawful for any *person* to *operate* a *pedicab* without a *police permit*.

- (c) It is unlawful for a *pedicab operator* to use an *operating permit* for a *traditional pedicab* to *operate* a *specialized pedicab*.
- (d) It is unlawful for a *pedicab operator* to use an *operating permit* for a *specialized pedicab* to *operate* a *traditional pedicab*.

(d) It is unlawful for any *operator* to charge a passenger a fare greater than the posted *fare schedule* or greater than the agreed upon fare recorded in the written invoice as set forth in Municipal Code section 33.4608(c).

- (c) It is unlawful to operate a pedicab in a manner that results in damage to public property.
- (d) It is unlawful to *operate* a *pedicab* while using any form of *sound amplification equipment*.

- (g) It is unlawful to *operate*, or for an *owner* to allow to be *operated*, a *pedicab* while carrying a number of passengers that exceeds the number of available seats.
- (h) It is unlawful to operate a pedicab unless all passengers are restrained by seatbelts.
- (i) It is unlawful to *operate*, or for an *owner* to allow to be *operated*, a
 pedicab in violation of the open container ordinance as set forth in
 Municipal Code section 56.54.
- (j) It is unlawful to operate, or for an owner to allow to be operated, a pedicab unless a color copy of the operator's permit, company trade name, and contact information, including a valid phone number, are securely attached to the interior of the pedicab and displayed in a manner clearly visible to all passengers while seated in the pedicab.
- (k) It is unlawful to operate, or for any owner to allow to be operated, a pedicab that produces a sound level that exceeds the applicable decibel limit for a respective zoning district as set forth in the Municipal Code section 59.5.0401.

§33.4618 Equipment Regulations for Pedicabs

- (a) It is unlawful to *operate*, or for any *owner* to allow to be *operated*, a *pedicab* during the hours of *darkness*, without:
 - Using battery-operated taillights mounted on the right and left, respectively, at the same level on the rear exterior of the passenger compartment. Taillights shall be red in color and plainly visible from all distances within 500 feet of the rear of the *pedicab*; and
 - (2) Using a battery-operated headlight that is mounted at the front of the *pedicab*. The headlight shall be white in color and plainly visible from all distances within 300 feet of the front of the *pedicab*.
- (b) It is unlawful for any person to *operate*, or for any *owner* to allow to be *operated*, a *pedicab* without a *seatbelt* or *seatbelts* for all passengers. *Seatbelts* shall be in proper working order.

- (c) It is unlawful to *operate*, or for any *owner* to allow to be *operated*, a
 pedicab in an unsafe condition as to endanger any person.
- (d) It is unlawful to *operate*, or for any *owner* to allow to be *operated*, a *pedicab* that does not comply with the exterior marking requirements in Municipal Code section 33.4619.
- (e) It is unlawful to *operate*, or for any *owner* to allow to be *operated*, a *pedicab* with strobing, flashing, or multi-color changing lights. Only static, single-color lights are allowed.
- (f) It is unlawful to operate, or for any owner to allow to be operated, a specialized pedicab with a pedal assist device.
- (g) It is unlawful to operate, or for any owner to allow to be operated, a pedicab that is equipped with sound amplification equipment.

§33.4619 Pedicab Exterior Markings – Owner Requirements

- (a) Owners shall permanently affix the owner's company trade name, the company phone number, and the identification number assigned by the City, on the exterior left and right sides of the *pedicab*, and the exterior rear of the *pedicab*, in a manner that is clearly visible to the public at all times. These markings shall meet the following requirements:

(a) It is unlawful for any *person* to *operate* a *pedicab* within the City of SanDiego unless at the time of such *operation* the *owner* has in effect a valid

policy of commercial general liability coverage or business auto coverage with a *pedicab* endorsement on the policy.

(b) The insurance policy, required to be issued under section 33.4620(a), shall be executed and delivered by a company with a rating of A in Best's Key Rating Guide and authorized to carry on an insurance business in the State of California, the financial responsibility of which company has been approved by the City. The terms of the policy shall provide that the insurance company assumes financial responsibility in an amount not less than \$1 million per occurrence for bodily injuries and personal injuries or property damage caused by the *operation* of the *pedicab*, including but not limited to, *pedicabs operated* by the officers, employees, agents, independent contractors, or lessees of the *owner*, and shall name the City of San Diego as an additional insured.

§33.4621 Pedicab Impound

- (a) Every *operator* and every *owner* is subject to applicable impound
 provisions in California Vehicle Code sections 22650 and 22651.
 Operators and *owners* are subject to the same rights and responsibilities as
 a driver of a motor vehicle as it relates to *pedicab* impounds.
- (b) Pedicabs subject to impound may be removed by City contract tow companies and are subject to City tow fees. Any peace officer, police officer, or parking enforcement officer engaged in traffic or parking enforcement may remove or impound a *pedicab* under any of the following circumstances:

- When an *operator* is physically incapacitated and unable to safely *operate* the *pedicab*;
- (5) When a *pedicab* is parked or left standing upon a City Street or sidewalk so as to obstruct the normal movement of vehicles or pedestrians or in a condition that creates a hazard; or

- (c) An owner of a pedicab removed under section 33.4621 shall be provided an opportunity for a post-storage hearing to determine the validity of the storage, in accordance with California Vehicle Code section 22852. The impounding agency shall have the burden of establishing the validity of the removal.

§33.4622 Denial, Suspension, or Revocation of Operating Permit, Pedicab Decal, or Pedicab Restricted Zone Decal; Appeal Rights

- (a) Operating permits, Pedicab Decals, or Pedicab Restricted Zone Decals may be denied, suspended, or revoked by the Chief of Police based upon any of the. following grounds:

- (c) It is unlawful to *operate* a *pedicab* on Garnet Avenue west of Ingraham

 Prospect Avenue between Coast Boulevard and Fay Avenue; Girard

It is unlawful to *operate* a *pedicab* within the perimeter of a permitted *Special Event* except where specifically authorized by the City Manager.

§83.0107 Restricted Pedicab Zones

- (a) A Pedicab Restricted Zone Decal shall be required to operate a pedicab within a Restricted Pedicab Zone.

- (g) It is unlawful to operate <u>operate</u>, or for any owner to allow to be operated <u>operated</u>, a <u>pedicab</u> with any sound production or reproduction device; radio receiving set, musical instrument, drums, phonograph, television set, loud speaker or sound amplifier, or other similar machine or device-in such a manner-as-to-be-plainly audible at a distance of fifty (50)-feet from the pedicab when the <u>pedicab</u>-is-upon a public street or highway <u>that is</u> equipped with <u>sound amplification equipment</u>.

§33.4619 Pedicab Exterior Markings <u>– Owner Requirements</u>

(a) Owners shall permanently affix the <u>owner's</u> company trade name, the company phone number, and the identification number assigned by the

City, on the <u>exterior left and right sides of the pedicab</u>, and the exterior rear of the <u>pedicab</u>, in a location <u>manner</u> that is clearly visible to the public at all times. These markings shall meet the following requirements:

- Font and color "Arial Bold" font in a color to produce maximum contrast, adequately spaced for maximum readability.

Chapter 8

Article 3: Alternative Transportation

Division 1: Pedicabs - Operation, Parking, and Zone Restrictions

§83.0101 Purpose

The Council finds that *pedicabs* are a popular form of non-motorized transportation in San Diego. This Division is enacted in response to concerns due to the increasing prevalence of *pedicabs*. It is the intent of this Division to facilitate the safe, orderly flow of traffic and to relieve congestion and traffic hazards associated with *pedicab* use.

§83.0102 Definitions

Defined terms appearing in this Division are shown in italics. Words or phrases not defined in this Division but defined in the California Vehicle Code shall have the meaning set forth in the California Vehicle Code. For purposes of this Division:

Martin Luther King Promenade [No change in text.]

Operator has the same meaning as in San Diego Municipal Code (Municipal Code) section 33.4602.

§83.0106 Pedicab Special Events Restrictions

It is unlawful to operate <u>operate</u> a *pedicab* within the perimeter of a permitted Special Event except where specifically authorized by the City <u>Manager</u>.

§83.0107 Restricted Pedicab Zones

- (a) A Pedicab Restricted Zone Decal shall be required to operate <u>operate</u> a pedicab within a Restricted Pedicab Zone.
