A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO APPROVING ANCILLARY NON-RESIDENTIAL USE FOR THE CUATRO AT CITY HEIGHTS AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECT WITHIN THE MID-CITY COMMUNITY PLAN AREA.

WHEREAS, in July 2018, the City Council approved the City's sale of unimproved real property located at 4050 El Cajon Boulevard and 3951, 4050, and 4102-4122 University

Avenue in the Mid-City Community Plan Area (Property) under Resolution R-311856; and WHEREAS, the City entered into a Purchase and Sale Agreement (PSA) with Cuatro at City Heights L.P., a California limited partnership (Developer) on March 25, 2019; and WHEREAS, based on the PSA, the Property is subject to a recorded Regulatory

Agreement and Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions Restricting Use of Property for Affordable Housing dated August 30, 2019 (Regulatory Agreement), requiring the development of the Property to include income and affordability restrictions on the residential housing units; and

WHEREAS, under the Regulatory Agreement, any non-residential use on the Property must be approved by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, Developer's project on the Property will include 117 residential units (including studios, one, two, and three-bedroom units), with 115 of those units affordable on a long-term basis to either extremely low income households (30 percent of area median income) or low income households (up to 60 percent of area median income), including 30 permanent supportive housing units for households experiencing homelessness, and two on-site manager's units not subject to affordability restrictions (Project); and

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WHEREAS, the Project will also include 3,356 square feet of ancillary non-residential

use that includes offices with on-site management, leasing, and resident services that will

provide supportive services, such as mental health and substance abuse treatment, to the

residents (Ancillary Use); and

WHEREAS, approving the Ancillary Use will allow Developer to construct the Project

and provide necessary supportive services to the residents; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Attorney has drafted this Resolution based on the

information provided by City staff (including information provided by affected third parties and

verified by City staff), with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and

accurate; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the Council approves

the Ancillary Use on the Property.
