A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT THE ALLOCATION OF DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEE FUNDS FOR THE PLANNING, DESIGN, AND PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING OF CARMEL MOUNTAIN RANCH POOL FACILITY ADA (B-24102), CHOLLAS CREEK OAK PARK BRANCH TRAIL IMPROVEMENTS (S-20012), CHOLLAS TRIANGLE PARK (P-20005), CLAY NEIGHBORHOOD PARK IMPROVEMENTS (B-22047), ELLEN BROWNING SCRIPPS PARK EXPANDED WALKWAY (P-24015), GOLF COURSE DRIVE IMPROVEMENTS (S-15040), HARD COURT IMPROVEMENTS (B-22045), HOWARD LAND PARK (L-24003), JOHN BACA PARK DEVELOPMENT (S-22004), MARCY NEIGHBORHOOD PARK IMPROVEMENTS (B-19188), MEMORIAL COMMUNITY PARK FIELD AND SECURITY LIGHTING (B-23028), MONTEZUMA PARK, COLLEGE AREA (P-21002). NORTH CHOLLAS COMMUNITY PARK IMPROVEMENTS (L-22004), RANCHO BERNARDO PARK IMPROVEMENTS (L-20000), ROBB FIELD GENERAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN IMPROVEMENTS (B-19133), SOUTHCREST PARK LIGHTING (B-24101) AND SUNSHINE BERARDINI NEIGHBORHOOD PARK (P-22006) IS STATUTORILY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTION 15262.

WHEREAS, on August 13, 2021, the Council of the City of San Diego (Council) approved Resolution R-313687 adopting the San Diego Parks Master Plan and Resolution R-313688 adopting a new Citywide Park Development Impact Fee (DIF); and

WHEREAS, as of November 8, 2023, there is approximately \$15.9 million available in the Citywide Park DIF fund; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the approximately \$15.9 million DIF balance, the City has access to approximately \$363,000 in community-based DIF funds in Golden Hill, Mid-City,

La Jolla, Encanto, Otay Mesa/Nestor, Southeastern, and Ocean Beach that are being allocated to park projects as a part of this action; and

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Department wishes to transfer and expend a total of approximately \$16.2 million of DIF allocations (between citywide and community-based) toward 19 park improvement projects, including funds for the planning, design, and preliminary engineering of Carmel Mountain Ranch Pool Facility ADA (B-24102), Chollas Creek Oak Park Branch Trail Improvements (S-20012), Chollas Triangle Park (P-20005), Clay Neighborhood Park Improvements (B-22047), Ellen Browning Scripps Park Expanded Walkway (P-24015), Golf Course Drive Improvements (S-15040), Hard Court Improvements (B-22045), Howard Lane Park (L-24003), John Baca Park Development (S-22004), Marcy Neighborhood Park Improvements (B-19188), Memorial Community Park Field and Security Lighting (B-23028), Montezuma Park, College Area (P-21002), North Chollas Community Park Improvements (L-22004), Rancho Bernardo Park Improvements (L-2000), Robb Field General Development Plan Improvements (B-19133), Southcrest Park Lighting (B-24101), and Sunshine Berardini Neighborhood Park (P-22006) (Projects); and

WHEREAS, the California State Legislature, through the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Public Resources Code sections 21000-21177, has determined that CEQA does not apply to various types of projects listed therein; and

WHEREAS, CEQA section 21084 states that the CEQA Guidelines shall list those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and which shall be exempt from CEQA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines sections 15260-15285 list the statutory exemptions promulgated by the California State Legislature; and

WHEREAS, the City Planning Department has established that the Projects are

statutorily exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15262 (Feasibility and

Planning Studies) which states that a project involving only feasibility or planning studies for

possible future actions which the agency, board, or commission has not approved, adopted, or

funded does not require the preparation of an EIR or Negative Declaration but does require

consideration of environmental factors; and

WHEREAS, the Council has considered the potential environmental effects of the

Projects, and

WHEREAS, the Council, using its independent judgment, has determined that the

Projects will not have a significant effect on the environment because they meet the requirements

of CEQA Guidelines Section 15262 in that the Projects involve only the feasibility and planning

for possible future actions; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Attorney has drafted this resolution based on the

information provided by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true,

and accurate; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego determines that the

Projects will not result in a significant effect on the environment and is statutorily exempt from

CEQA under CEQA Guidelines section 15262.
