A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT THE 2182 OLIVER AVENUE - PROJECT NO. PRJ-0696708 IS CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) PURSUANT TO SECTION 15332 (INFILL DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS) OF THE CEQA GUIDELINES.

WHEREAS, on January 21, 2022, Ed Siefken, Applicant; and Nathan Siefken and Miriam Siefken, Husband and Wife as Joint Tenants, Owners, filed an application with the City of San Diego for a Coastal Development Permit and Public Right-of-Way Vacation to demolish an existing detached garage and construct a new two-story 1,408 square-foot single-dwelling unit; and vacate a portion of Olney Street located at 2182 Oliver Avenue (Project) in the Pacific Beach Community Plan area; and

WHEREAS, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.), section 21084, states that the CEQA Guidelines thereto (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15000 et seq.) shall list those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and which shall be exempt from CEQA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines sections 15300-15333 list the categorical exemptions promulgated by the California Office of Planning and Research and adopted by the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency for those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, the Development Services Department has established that the Project is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15332 (In-Fill

Development Projects) and that no exception to the exemption, as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2, applies to the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego (City Council) has considered the potential environmental effects of the Project; and

WHEREAS, on July 1, 2024, the City Council held a duly noticed public meeting and considered the written record for the Project as well as public comment; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, using its independent judgment, has determined that the Project will not have a significant effect on the environment and is consistent with the criteria set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15332 (In-Fill Development Projects). The proposed development is consistent with the applicable general plan designation and all applicable general plan policies as well as with applicable zoning designation and regulations; occurs within city limits on a project site of no more than five acres substantially surrounded by urban uses; the project site has no value as habitat for endangered, rare or threatened species; the project would not result in any significant effects related to air quality, noise, traffic or water quality; and the site can be adequately serviced by all required utilities and public services; and

WHEREAS, under Charter section 280(a)(2) this Resolution is not subject to veto by the Mayor because this matter requires the City Council to act as a quasi-judicial body and where a public hearing was required by law implicating due process rights of individuals affected by the decision and where the City Council was required by law to consider evidence at the hearing and to make legal findings based on the evidence presented; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Attorney has drafted this Resolution based on the information provided by City Staff, including information provided by affected third parties and

verified by City Staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true and

accurate; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego determines that the Project

is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15332 (In-Fill

Development Projects).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego determines

that an exception to the exemption as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 does not

apply.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk, or designee, is directed to file a

Notice of Exemption in accordance with CEQA with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors for

the County of San Diego and the State Clearinghouse in the Office of Planning and Research

regarding the Project.
