A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
SAN DIEGO APPROVING TLOXP TECHNOLOGY UNDER  
THE TRANSPARENT AND RESPONSIBLE USE OF  
SURVEILLANCE TECHNOLOGY ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, the San Diego Police Department (SDPD) uses TLOxp technology, which falls within the definition of surveillance technology under San Diego Municipal Code Chapter 2, Article 10, Division 1, the Transparent and Responsible Use of Technology Ordinance (TRUST Ordinance); and

WHEREAS, approval of the Council of the City of San Diego (Council) is required under the TRUST Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, TLOxp is an internet based, on-line service provided by TransUnion that offers real-time resources to locate information about individuals, utilities, and assets; and

WHEREAS, TLOxp is used by SDPD's investigative units and crime analysts to support criminal investigations; and

WHEREAS, use of this technology is limited to persons involved in active criminal investigations, the public has no access to the TLOxp system or information contained in the database, and there is no third-party data sharing; and

WHEREAS, there is no alternative with lesser economic cost or impact on civil liberties or rights. TLOxp consolidates various data sources into a single platform, which saves detectives time and effort in gathering information and research. The estimated cost per fiscal year is \$14,000; and

WHEREAS, the TLOxp technology will be used Citywide and SDPD held community meetings discussing TLOxp technology in all Council Districts on January 11, 2024, received

public comment, and incorporated the public comments and written responses into the Surveillance Impact Report; and

WHEREAS, SDPD has prepared and publicly released and posted a Surveillance Use Policy and a Surveillance Impact Report for TLOxp technology, on file with the City Clerk as document numbers RR-315698-1 and RR-315698-2; and

WHEREAS, SDPD notified the Chair of the Privacy Advisory Board (Board) of the TLOxp technology and provided a Surveillance Use Policy and Surveillance Impact Report on January 16, 2024; and

WHEREAS, although draft recommendations were posted by the Board, the Board did not adopt a recommendation on the proposed surveillance technology within 90 days of notice to the Board Chair, and SDPD now seeks Council approval of the TLOxp technology; and

WHEREAS, the Council has considered the Surveillance Use Policy and Surveillance Impact Report for TLOxp technology; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Attorney has drafted this resolution based on the information provided by City staff with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the benefits to the community of TLOxp technology outweigh the costs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council determines the City's proposal for TLOxp technology will safeguard civil liberties and civil rights.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council determines that no alternative with a lesser economic cost or lesser impact on civil rights or civil liberties would be as effective as TLOxp technology.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that TLOxp technology is hereby approved by the Council under the TRUST Ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this approval is not intended to and shall not supersede existing processes to seek approval for the appropriation and expenditure of specific funds through the annual budget process, or existing processes for the approval and execution of contracts, donations, and grants.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council shall review this approval annually as required by the TRUST Ordinance.
