AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AND INTERGRAPH CORPORATION THROUGH ITS HEXAGON SAFETY, INFRASTRUCTURE & GEOSPATIAL DIVISION FOR A COMPUTER AIDED DISPATCH SYSTEM.

RECITALS

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Ordinance based on the following:

- A. The San Diego Police Department uses a Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) system for dispatching police officers to 911 and non-emergency calls for services. The CAD systems plays a vital role in ensuring efficient, coordinated, and accountable emergency response operations, making it a critical component of the public safety infrastructure.
- B. On September 29, 2020, Council authorized a sole source agreement with Hexagon for ongoing annual maintenance, proprietary software licensing, and Resident Systems Administrator (RSA) services for the CAD system for a term of three (3) years with two (2) additional one (1) year options for a total term of five (5) years for an amount not to exceed \$5,878,244.48 (Contract) (R-313223), which will expire on October 12, 2025.
- C. The Hexagon Contract was amended on September 6, 2023, to exercise the two additional one-year options, which includes the pricing for the maintenance services and RSA services, for the full five year term.
- D. On April 18, 2023, the City issued RFP 10089968-23-E for a new replacement CAD system. As the City finalizes the detailed competitive solicitation process and implementation process, the existing CAD system requires continued maintenance and support

until a replacement CAD system is implemented, staff has been trained, and the system is fully accepted.

- E. The Second Amendment will allow Hexagon to continue to provide annual maintenance for system software updates and technical support, onsite support through a Resident Service Administrator, and other services necessary to support this critical public safety system.
- F. On October 16, 2024, the City's Purchasing Agent certified in writing that the sole source to amend the existing contract with Hexagon meets the requirements set forth in San Diego Municipal Code section 22.3016.
- G. The City now desires to enter into a Second Amendment with Hexagon for continued services to maintain the CAD system for one (1) year with up to four (4) additional one-year options, and to increase the not to exceed amount by \$6,500,000.
- H. Under Charter section 99, no contract, agreement, or obligation extending for a period of more than five years may be authorized except by Ordinance approved by a two-thirds majority vote of the City Council.
- I. The Office of the City Attorney prepared this Ordinance based on the information provided by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete and accurate.

ACTION ITEMS

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of San Diego:

Section 1. The Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute the Second Amendment with Hexagon for annual maintenance services, RSA services, software licensing and subsequent change orders to upgrade and maintain the CAD System for a one (1) year term with four (4) additional one-year options, for a total term of ten (10) years, and to increase the

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not to exceed amount by \$6,5000,000 for a total not to exceed amount of \$12,378,244.48 under

the terms and conditions set forth in the contract on file in the Office of the City Clerk as

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Section 2. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to expend an amount not to

exceed \$6,5000,000 over the next five years for a total not to exceed amount of \$12,378,244.48

from the General Fund (100000) Police Department (1914), over the total (10) year term of the

contract, contingent upon adoption of the Annual Appropriations Ordinance for the applicable

fiscal year and contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer furnishing a certificate certifying that

funds necessary for expenditure are, or will be, on deposit with the City Treasurer.

Section 3. The Council dispenses with a full reading of this Ordinance before its

passage because a written copy of this Ordinance was made available to the Council and the

public before the date of its passage.

Section 4. This Ordinance will take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from

and after its final passage.
