DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE **FEB 27 2025**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HIS
DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO AN
AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AND
BRYCER LLC FOR THE COMPLIANCE ENGINE.

RECITALS

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Ordinance based on the following:

A. The Fire-Rescue Department's (SDFD) Community Risk Reduction (CRR)

Division has more than 20,000 fire protection reports in The Compliance Engine (TCE) system. TCE, owned by Brycer LLC, is an effective tool that replaces submittal paper-based reports as required by the 2022 California Fire Code.

B. Under the California Fire Code, Chapter 1, Section 109.3, Record Keeping, "a record of periodic inspections, tests, servicing and other operations shall be maintained. Records shall be made available for the fire code official, and a copy shall be provided to the fire code official upon request. The fire code official is authorized to prescribe the form and format of such record keeping." TCE currently performs the functions for CRR, as required by the California Fire Code.

C. On February 19, 2020, the City entered into an agreement with Brycer, LLC for three (3) years, with a two (2) year automatic renewal option. The terms of the original agreement with Brycer LLC state the agreement expires on January 2, 2025. SDFD seeks Council approval of the first amendment to the agreement with Brycer LLC for TCE (First Amendment) to extend the term of the agreement through June 30, 2025. The extension of the

agreement will be for a term retroactive to January 3, 2025, beginning on the Effective Date and extending through June 30, 2025.

D. The proposed First Amendment will allow CRR to continue to efficiently conduct the review of fire protection systems reports within the jurisdiction of the City. In addition, the contract extension will assist the SDFD's CRR Division in carrying out its mission "to protect the community of San Diego by preventing fire and other hazardous conditions through education and enforcement of life safety codes."

E. The City is not obligated under the original agreement or the First Amendment to pay Brycer LLC, as Brycer LLC collects all fees due and payable by third-party inspectors.

F. The Office of the City Attorney prepared this Ordinance based on the information provided by City staff, (including information provided by affected third parties and verified by City staff), with the understanding that this information is complete and accurate.

G. Under San Diego Charter Section 99, no contract, agreement, or obligation extending for a period of more than five years except by Ordinance approved by two-thirds majority vote of the City Council.

ACTION ITEMS


Be it ordained by the Council of the City of San Diego:

Section 1. Authorizes the Mayor or his designee to execute the First Amendment to an agreement between the City of San Diego and Brycer LLC, extending the term of the agreement through June 30, 2025.

Section 2. The Council dispenses with a full reading of this Ordinance before its passage because a written copy of this Ordinance was made available to the Council and the public before the date of its passage.

Section 3. This Ordinance will take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.
