### ORDINANCE NUMBER O- 21928 (NEW SERIES)

### DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE MAR 1 4 2025

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 2, DIVISION 2 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY REPEALING SECTION 22.0220; AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 2, DIVISION 18 BY AMENDING SECTION 22.1801; AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 2, DIVISION 24, BY AMENDING SECTION 22.2403; AND AMENDING CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 8, DIVISION 1, BY AMENDING SECTION 68.0101 RELATING TO CITY DEPARTMENTS.

#### RECITALS

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Ordinance based on the following:

A. In November 2023, the Mayor consolidated the City of San Diego's (City)
 Department of Real Estate and Airport Management (DREAM) under the City's Economic
 Development Department (EDD) to align all real estate functions under one department to create
 greater operational efficiencies and customer service.

B. San Diego Charter (Charter) section 26 requires the Council adopt an
 Administrative Code in the San Diego Municipal Code, describing the detailed powers and
 duties of City administrative offices and departments.

C. It is now recommended that the following San Diego Municipal Code sections be amended or repealed: (1) repealing Chapter 2, Article 2, Division 2, section 22.0220; (2) amending Chapter 2, Article 2, Division 18, section 22.1801; (3) amending Chapter 2, Article 2, Division 24, section 22.2403; and (4) amending Chapter 6, Article 8, Division 1, section 68.0101, by removing references to the Real Estate and Airport Management department and moving enumerated duties of that former department to fall under the Economic Development Department.

D. The Office of the City Attorney prepared this Ordinance based on the information provided by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete and accurate.

E. Under San Diego Charter section 26, a supermajority vote of the Council is required for passage of this Ordinance.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of San Diego:

Section 1. Chapter 2, Article 2, Division 2 of the San Diego Municipal Code is amended by repealing section 22.0220.

Section 2. Chapter 2, Article 2, Division 18 of the San Diego Municipal Code is amended by amending section 22.1801 to read as follows:

be responsible for performing those duties and functions as assigned and directed by the Mayor or City Manager, including:

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- performing administrative functions and duties related to managing the City's real estate and airport needs, such as property valuation, leasing City-owned real property, and acquiring real property interests for the City;
- (2) managing City airports as provided in Chapter 6, Article 8 of the Municipal Code;
- (3) acquiring and managing public rights-of-way and easements;
- (4) coordinating with the County Tax Collector regarding property that may be sold because of delinquent taxes that the City may desire for public use;
- (5) performing administrative functions required for eminent domain proceedings;
- (6) performing administrative functions to manage leases and concessions at City-owned properties;
- (7) inspecting and maintaining City-owned real property;
- (8) periodically reviewing City-owned real property to identify underutilized real properties; and
- (9) managing and controlling Pueblo Lands and unimproved City properties that are not under the control of a specific City department.

Section 4. Chapter 6, Article 8, Division 1 of the San Diego Municipal Code is amended by amending section 68.0101 to read as follows:

#### §68.0101 Definitions

(e) DIRECTOR means the Director of the City department responsible for overseeing the City's airports and their authorized assistants, deputies, employees, and representatives.

(f) through (m) [No change in text.]

Section 5. The Council dispenses with a full reading of this Ordinance before its passage because a written copy of this Ordinance was made available to the Council and the public before the date of its passage.

Section 6. This Ordinance will take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.

  - (1) performing administrative functions and duties related to managing the City's real estate and airport needs, such as property valuation,

leasing City-owned real property, and acquiring real property interests for the City;

- (2) managing City airports as provided in Chapter 6, Article 8 of the Municipal Code;
- (3) acquiring and managing public rights-of-way and easements;
- (4) --- coordinating with the County Tax Collector regarding property that may be sold because of delinquent taxes that the City may desire for public use;
- (5) performing administrative functions required for eminent domain proceedings;
- (6) performing administrative functions to manage leases and concessions at City-owned properties;

- (8) periodically reviewing City owned real property to identify underutilized real properties; and
- (9) managing and controlling Pueblo Lands and unimproved City properties that are not under the control of a specific City department.
