AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE CONTRACT WITH THE SAN DIEGO FUTURES FOUNDATION FOR THE END-OF-LIFE COMPUTER HARDWARE DONATION PROJECT.

## **RECITALS**

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Ordinance based on the following:

- A. The City of San Diego (City) regularly replaces its computers when the equipment is at the end of its useful life for service for the City or otherwise does not adequately satisfy the City's requirements.
- B. There are underserved communities in the City that would benefit from being able to use computer equipment that the City determines it needs to replace.
- C. The mission of San Diego Futures Foundation (SDFF), a local, tax-exempt, 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, focuses on improving lives in San Diego by making information technology available to underserved populations by providing technology equipment to nonprofit organizations, low income individuals, and other eligible participants.
- D. Effective as of September 4, 2020, the City entered into a contract with San Diego Futures Foundation for the End-of-Life Computer Hardware Project (Contract).
- E. The City is requesting that the Council approve this ordinance authorizing execution of a First Amendment to the Contract, to extend the Contract term for an additional three (3) year base term, effective September 4, 2025 through September 3, 2028, with two (2) additional one-year option periods, for a total contract term of ten (10) years.

- F. In August 2020, the San Diego City Council, via O-21228, authorized the City's Chief Information Officer to implement an End-of-Life Computer Donation Program, and a no-cost, nonprofit agreement with the San Diego Futures Foundation was executed to operationalize the program shortly thereafter.
- G. The refurbished computers, monitors, keyboards and more provide members of a household with opportunities to search and apply for work, conduct work and school activities remotely, access e-government services such as the City's Get It Done application, communicate with friends and family, and have easier access to health and safety information providers.
- H. If this ordinance is approved and the term of the Contract is extended, the City will be able to continue to provide SDFF with computer hardware to refurbish and then provide at a low cost to San Diegans who meet standard criteria, including being a San Diego County resident and providing proof of low income or government assistance; some of the individuals who receive computers include students, veterans, seniors, or those who have documented disabilities.
- I. Under San Diego City Charter section 99, no contract, agreement, or obligation extending for a period of more than five years may be authorized except by ordinance approved by a two-thirds' majority vote of the Council.
- J. The Office of the City Attorney prepared this Ordinance based on the information provided by City staff, including information provided by affected third parties and verified by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete and accurate.

## **ACTION ITEMS**

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of San Diego:

Section 1. The Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute, for and on behalf of the City, the First Amendment to the Contract with the San Diego Futures Foundation (SDFF) for the End-of-Life Computer Hardware Donation Program, to extend the Contract term for an additional three (3) year term, effective September 4, 2025 through September 3, 2028, with two (2) additional one-year option periods, for a total contract term of ten (10) years, and otherwise modify the Contract pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Amendment to the Contract, on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. OO - 21942

Section 2. The Council dispenses with a full reading of this Ordinance before its passage because a written copy of this Ordinance was made available to the Council and the public before the date of its passage.

Section 3. This Ordinance will take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.
