DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE JUN 1 8 2025

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE THE SECOND AMENDMENT TO AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AND BRYCER LLC FOR THE COMPLIANCE ENGINE.

RECITALS

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Ordinance based on the following:

A. The Fire-Rescue Department's (SDFD) Community Risk Reduction (CRR)
Division has more than 20,000 fire protection reports in The Compliance Engine (TCE) system.
TCE, owned by Brycer LLC, is an effective tool that replaces submittal paper-based reports as required by the 2022 California Fire Code.

B. Under the California Fire Code, Chapter 1, Section 109.3, Record Keeping, "a record of periodic inspections, tests, servicing and other operations shall be maintained. Records shall be made available for the fire code official, and a copy shall be provided to the fire code official upon request. The fire code official is authorized to prescribe the form and format of such record keeping." TCE currently performs the functions for CRR, as required by the California Fire Code.

C. On February 19, 2020, the City entered into an agreement with Brycer, LLC for three (3) years, with a two (2) year automatic renewal option. On February 25, 2025, Council adopted an Ordinance approving the first amendment to the agreement with Brycer LLC for TCE (First Amendment) to extend the term of the agreement through June 30, 2025. The extension of the agreement was for a term retroactive to January 3, 2025, beginning on the Effective Date and extending through June 30, 2025.

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D. The First Amendment was intended to allow CRR to continue to efficiently conduct the review of fire protection systems reports within the jurisdiction of the City while it worked to implement the possible transition from TCE to a new vendor, 3Di. The term of the extension period pursuant to the First Amendment was not sufficient for CRR to make a transition to its new vendor, while ensuring continuity in service. Therefore, SDFD seeks approval of the second amendment to the agreement with Brycer LLC for TCE (Second Amendment) to extend the term of the agreement through June 30, 2026.

E. Under the proposed Second Amendment, the City will continue to utilize Brycer LLC for TCE, though June 30, 2026. This Second Amendment will ensure sufficient time to transition to 3Di, while maintaining continuity and access to limit any disruption to current services. During the transition period, SDFD will work with 3Di to initiate and set up new software, import existing data, and customize the system to pursue the same or similar services.

F. The City is not obligated under the original agreement, the First Amendment, or the proposed Second Amendment to pay Brycer LLC, as Brycer LLC collects all fees due and payable by third-party inspectors.

G. The Office of the City Attorney prepared this Ordinance based on the information provided by City staff, (including information provided by affected third parties and verified by City staff), with the understanding that this information is complete and accurate.

H. Under San Diego Charter Section 99, no contract, agreement, or obligation extending for a period of more than five years except by Ordinance approved by two-thirds majority vote of the City Council.

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ACTION ITEMS

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of San Diego:

Section 1. Authorizes the Mayor or his designee to execute the Second Amendment to an agreement between the City of San Diego and Brycer LLC, extending the term of the agreement through June 30, 2026.

Section 2. The Council dispenses with a full reading of this Ordinance before its passage because a written copy of this Ordinance was made available to the Council and the public before the date of its passage.

Section 3. This Ordinance will take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.
