DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE JAN 2 3 2025

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DECLARING A CONTINUED LOCAL EMERGENCY RELATED TO THE JANUARY 22, 2024 SEVERE WINTER STORM.

RECITALS

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Resolution based on the following:

A. On January 22, 2024, a severe winter storm occurred in San Diego.

B. The storm produced a new record for daily precipitation with 2.73 inches of rain.

C. The storm caused widespread flooding throughout the City of San Diego (City)

and resulted in significant emergency response and recovery activities.

D. The emergency responses included swift water rescue operations, traffic control,

debris removal, cleaning and repairing of storm drains, and tree and mud removal.

E. City public facilities incurred damage caused by flooding, high winds, and fallen trees.

F. On January 22, 2024, Mayor Todd Gloria (Mayor) declared a local emergency, which the Council ratified on January 29, 2024, in San Diego Resolution R-315327, and extended most recently on November 19, 2024, in San Diego Resolution R-315899.

G. On January 22, 2024, the County of San Diego proclaimed a local emergency due to the storm.

H. On January 23, 2024, the Governor of California, Gavin Newsom, declared a state of emergency in San Diego due to the storm.

I. On February 19, 2024, President Joseph R. Biden declared a major disaster in San Diego related to the storm and ordered federal assistance, making federal funding available to supplement state and local recovery efforts in impacted neighborhoods.

J. Based on the severe impacts from the January 22, 2024 storm, and the City's ongoing recovery and assistance efforts, conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property continue to persist within the City of San Diego.

K. State financial assistance provided through the California Disaster Assistance Act may be available to the City due to the existing local emergency proclamation, coupled with the proclaimed state of emergency by the Governor of California.

L. Additionally, through Council-approved funding for direct housing and rental assistance, impacted residents continue to work with the San Diego Housing Commission (Commission) to identify stable housing and receive continuing housing assistance payments.

M. The Commission contracted with the Harvey Family Foundation to assess flood damage at homes within the City and to contract for labor and materials to complete necessary repairs. There are active restoration assistance efforts currently underway and additional assessments still under review.

N. On January 7, 2025, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development announced the allocation of nearly \$12 billion in Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds for use nationwide. California will receive \$416,597,000 of those funds, and San Diego's January 22, 2024 storm is eligible for this disaster recovery funding. The specific amount awarded to San Diego will be determined at a later date.

O. CDBG-DR funds may be used to replace affordable housing, strengthen infrastructure and public facilities, support economic revitalization, and implement disaster mitigation measures.

P. The ongoing provision of this critically needed relief necessitates continuing the state of local emergency.

Q. California Government Code (Government Code) section 8630 authorizes local governing bodies to proclaim local emergencies when such events occur as are defined by Government Code section 8558(c), provided further by section 8630 that the local governing body must review the state of emergency at least every 60 days until the emergency is declared to be terminated and shall proclaim the termination of the local emergency at the earliest possible date that conditions warrant.

R. The Office of the City Attorney has drafted this resolution based on the information provided by City staff with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate.

ACTION ITEMS

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of San Diego:

1. Under Government Code section 8630, a continued state of local emergency is declared to persist due to the January 22, 2024 severe winter storm.

The measures previously taken by the Mayor and the Council in San Diego
Resolution R-315327 shall continue to have full force and effect.
