A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO APPROVING FISCAL YEAR 2025 ARTS, CULTURE, AND COMMUNITY FESTIVALS (ACCF) FUNDING ALLOCATIONS, PURSUANT TO COUNCIL POLICY 100-23, RECOMMENDED BY COUNCIL DISTRICT 4 TO NINE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS; APPROVING A WAIVER OF COUNCIL POLICY 100-23 SECTION 2(G) FOR CERTAIN ALLOCATIONS; AND RELATED ACTIONS.

RECITALS

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Resolution based on the following:

- A. The Council adopted Council Policy 100-23, "City Council Funding of Arts, Culture and Community Festivals with Discretionary Transient Occupancy Tax Allocations," through Resolution R-307625 (Aug. 13, 2012). Council Policy 100-23 establishes uniform guidelines, conditions, and criteria governing the application for and granting of funds to nonprofit organizations to support their ongoing operational expenses and their sponsorship of special events. Annual funding levels are subject to the amount of Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) allocated to each Councilmember in a given fiscal year. Granting Arts, Culture and Community Festivals (ACCF) funds is at the discretion of each Councilmember during the fiscal year.
- B. Councilmembers may grant ACCF funds to nonprofit organizations that produce programs, projects, and events that provide access to excellence in culture and the arts for residents of, and visitors to, the City of San Diego (City), and enrich the lives of the people of San Diego and build healthy, vital neighborhoods.
- C. Council Policy 100-23 requires each grant of ACCF funding to a nonprofit organization be done by Council resolution.

- D. Nonprofit organizations granted ACCF funds shall enter an ACCF grant agreement with the City that specifies their responsibilities regarding the use of ACCF grant funds and stipulating that the nonprofit organization shall document all their expenses as required by the ACCF grant agreement.
- E. For Fiscal Year 2025, Council District 4 recommends allocating \$42,500 in ACCF grant funds to nine nonprofit organizations, as identified in the accompanying Staff Report (Staff Report) and supporting materials.
- F. Council determines that the use of ACCF funds by each nonprofit organization identified in the Staff Report and supporting materials fits within the parameters of Council Policy 100-23, except funds used for events or programs that have already occurred, or for goods, supplies, or materials that have already been purchased.
- G. The Office of the City Attorney prepared this Resolution based on the information provided by City staff, including information provided by affected third parties and verified by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete and accurate.

ACTION ITEMS

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of San Diego:

- 1. Council District 4's recommended allocations of Fiscal Year 2025 Arts, Culture and Community Festivals (ACCF) funds to nine nonprofit organizations for eligible uses pursuant to Council Policy 100-23, as identified in the Staff Report and supporting materials, are approved.
- 2. The Mayor, or designee, is authorized to enter an Arts, Culture and Community Festivals Fiscal Year 2025 City Council Allocations Grant Agreement between the City of

San Diego and each of the nine nonprofit organizations identified in the Staff Report and supporting materials.

3. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to expend an amount not to exceed \$42,500 from Council District 4: TOT Fund 200205 / Cost Center 1414111215 / GL 512059, to provide funds to the nonprofit organizations identified in the Staff Report and supporting materials, contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer first furnishing one or more certificates certifying that the funds necessary for expenditure are, or will be, on deposit with the City Treasurer.

4. For the allocations identified as item 6 (Project New Village), item 7 (San Diego Hip Hop Health & Wellness), item 8 (San Diego Original Black Panther Party), and item 9 (The Grandparents Connection, Inc.) in the Staff Report and supporting materials, Council waives Council Policy 100-23 section 2(g), which prohibits ACCF funds being used for events or programs that have already occurred, or for goods, supplies, or materials that have already been purchased.

5. The allocations described in this Resolution, Staff Report, and supporting materials are made for a public purpose.
