A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO CONFIRMING REAPPOINTMENTS TO THE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN.

## **RECITALS**

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Resolution based on the following:

- A. The Commission on the Status of Women (Commission) is established in San Diego Municipal Code section 26.13 (Municipal Code) as an advisory board to advise the Mayor, Council, and other agencies of the City of San Diego of the needs and problems of women in the San Diego area and to recommend programs designed to alleviate inequities that may confront women in social, economic, and vocational pursuits.
- B. The Municipal Code provides that the Commission shall consist of eleven members appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Council, and that terms shall be staggered so that no more than six members have terms expiring in any one year. Under the Municipal Code, terms shall be two years, with an expiration date of March 1, and each member shall serve until a successor is duly appointed and qualified.
- C. The Municipal Code sets forth the Commission's duties and functions, including: maintaining an active liaison with citizens' groups interested in the problems facing women; finding new ways or promoting awareness of the changing life patterns, opportunities, and responsibilities of women; investigating and recommending programs which will provide women a greater opportunity and ability to pursue alternative lifestyles without discrimination; suggesting methods through which existing inequities in pay and job opportunities can be

alleviated; performing studies and surveys on the status of women as requested by the Mayor and Council; and submitting an annual report to the Council at the end of each fiscal year.

D. The Office of the City Attorney has drafted this resolution based on the information provided by City staff, including information provided by affected third parties and verified by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate.
