

RESOLUTION NUMBER R- **316213**DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE **MAY 22 2025**

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT APPROVAL OF AN ADDITIONAL FISCAL YEAR 2025 COMMUNITY PROJECTS, PROGRAMS, AND SERVICES (CPPS) FUNDING ALLOCATION, PURSUANT TO COUNCIL POLICY 100-06, RECOMMENDED BY COUNCIL DISTRICT 4 TO THE BLUE HEART FOUNDATION FOR THE BHF TEEN CENTER IS CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTION 15301.

RECITALS

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Resolution based on the following:

1. The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.) states the CEQA Guidelines thereto (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15000 et seq.) shall list those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and which shall be exempt from CEQA.
2. Pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines sections 15300-15333 lists categorical exemptions promulgated by the California Office of Planning and Research and adopted by the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency for those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment.
3. The City of San Diego (City) desires to approve an additional allocation of Fiscal Year 2025 Community Projects, Programs, and Services (CPPS) funds to the Blue Heart Foundation for the BHF Teen Center recommended by Council District 4, as identified in the accompanying Staff Report (Staff Report) and supporting materials (Proposed Action).

4. The Planning Department considered the Proposed Action and determined that the Proposed Action is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15301 (Existing Facilities) and no exceptions to the exemption, as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2, apply.

5. The Council has considered the potential environmental effects of the Proposed Action and held a duly noticed public meeting and considered the written record for the Proposed Action as well as public comment.

6. The Council, using its independent judgment, has determined that the Proposed Action is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15301 (Existing Facilities), which exempts the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former uses.

7. The Office of the City Attorney has drafted this resolution based on the information provided by City staff, including information provided by affected third parties and verified by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate.

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of San Diego:


