A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT AUTHORIZING THE APPLICATION FOR, ACCEPTANCE, APPROPRIATION, AND EXPENDITURE OF GRANT FUNDS FROM THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT 2024 DISASTER RECOVERY INFRASTRUCTURE/MIT-RIPP PROGRAM FOR THE STREAMVIEW DRIVE GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT, ARE EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTION 15061(B)(3).

RECITALS

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Resolution based on the following:

A. The Council will consider approval of authorizing the Mayor, or their designee, to apply for, accept, appropriate, and expend California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) grant funding from the 2024 Disaster Recovery Infrastructure/ MIT-RIPP Program in an amount not to exceed \$11,987,501 in support of construction for the Streamview Drive Green Infrastructure Project B-19095 (Project).

B. The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), California Public Resources Code (Code) sections 21000 through 21189.3, provides in Code section 21083 that the California Office of Planning and Research will promulgate, and the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency will adopt, guidelines for implementation of CEQA. The California Office of Planning and Research promulgated, and the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency adopted, the guidelines for implementation of CEQA set forth in Title 14 California Code of Regulations sections 15000 through 15387 (CEQA Guidelines).

C. CEQA section 21065 states that a “project” is “an activity which may cause either a direct physical change in the environment, or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment....” A project is exempt from CEQA if the project is: (1) exempt by statute; (2) exempt pursuant to a categorical exemption and the application of that categorical exemption is not barred by an exception set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2; or (3) the activity is covered by the common sense exemption that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment.

D. The common sense exemption is applicable where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

E. The Streamview Drive Green Infrastructure Project B-19095 was previously determined to be exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15301 (Existing Facilities), 15302 (Replacement or Reconstruction) and 15303 (New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures) on January 13, 2021. A Notice of Right to Appeal the Environmental Determination for the Project was posted and no appeals were received by the close of the appeal period.

F. The proposed Council action authorizing the Mayor, or their designee, to apply for, accept, appropriate, and expend the HCD grant funding in support of the Streamview Drive Green Infrastructure Project B-19095 is a fiscal and administrative activity that will not change the scope of the Project, and there is no potential for new or different environmental impacts which would require further evaluation under CEQA.

G. The Council has considered the written record related to the Project and all public comments about the potential environmental effects of the Project. The Council, using its independent judgment, has determined that the Project is exempt from the provisions of CEQA under CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3), under the common sense exemption that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment.

H. The Office of the City Attorney prepared this Resolution based on the information provided by City staff (including information provided by affected third parties and verified by City staff), with the understanding that this information is complete and accurate.

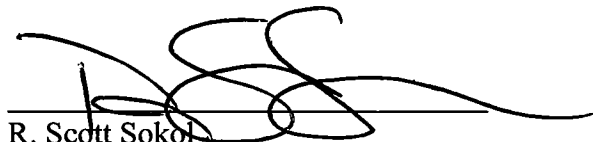
ACTION ITEMS

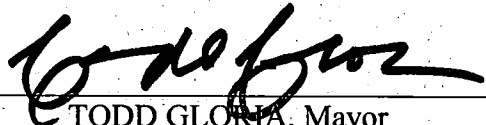
