A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, APPROPRIATE, AND EXPEND GRANT FUNDS FROM THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT'S 2024 DISASTER RECOVERY INFRASTRUCTURE/MIT-RIPP PROGRAM AND REPEALING COUNCIL RESOLUTION R-316613 REGARDING APPROVAL TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, APPROPRIATE, AND EXPEND GRANT FUNDS FROM THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT 2024 DISASTER RECOVERY INFRASTRUCTURE AND MITIGATION RESILIENCE INFRASTRUCTURE AND PLANNING PROGRAMS.

RECITALS

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Resolution based on the following:

A. The California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) was allocated \$416,597,000 by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to support long-term recovery efforts following the 2023 and 2024 severe winter storms, flooding, landslides, and mudslides (FEMA Disaster Numbers 4699, 4707, and 4758).

B. HCD will utilize a portion of the HUD allocation to fund Disaster Recovery Infrastructure projects in California.

C. The City of San Diego (City) has been pre-selected by HCD to apply for 2024 Disaster Recovery Infrastructure/MIT-RIPP funds for the City Stormwater Department's Streamview Drive Green Infrastructure Project B-19095 (Project). The City is eligible to receive \$11,987,501 in funds (Grant Funds).

D. The Project is located within the Mid-City Eastern Community Planning Group area, near the boundary of Council Districts 4 and 9 adjacent to Chollas Creek, an urban waterway that was impacted during the severe rainstorms in January 2024. The Project will improve the capture and conveyance of urban runoff and include new stormwater treatment systems, which will help reduce the level of pollutants entering Chollas Creek and manage stormwater peak flows.

E. The Project supports the City's Strategic Plan and falls within Climate Action Plan Strategy 5 – Resilient Infrastructure and Healthy Ecosystems, specifically the implementation of waterways restoration projects that attenuate flow, filter pollutants, restore natural processes, and protect surrounding properties and land from flood risk.

F. HCD requires that the City's grant application include an executed authorizing resolution documenting authority to submit an application and authority to enter into a HCD Standard Agreement (Grant Agreement) for the 2024 Disaster Recovery Infrastructure/MIT-RIPP funding, setting forth the terms and conditions by which the funds are utilized.

G. The Council previously adopted Resolution R-316613 on February 11, 2026, authorizing the City to apply for, accept, appropriate and expend Disaster Recovery Infrastructure (DR-Infrastructure) and Mitigation Resilience Infrastructure and Planning Program (MIT-RIPP) funds from HCD for the Project.

H. Subsequent to the Council's adoption of Resolution R-316613, HCD advised the City that the funds for the Project would originate from a program entitled 2024 Disaster Recovery Infrastructure/MIT-RIPP, and as a result of this program name change, HCD now

requires the City to provide a new resolution authorizing the submission of an application and authorizing entry into a Grant Agreement for this fund, specifically named 2024 Disaster Recovery Infrastructure/MIT-RIPP.

I. Acceptance of the Grant Funds will result in a revenue increase of \$11,987,501 in the City's Capital Improvements Program budget and be appropriated to the Project for construction and related activities. The remaining Project costs will be funded by the Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (WIFIA) of 2014 master loan agreement and by local city funds. There are no matching fund requirements for this grant.

J. On January 15, 2026, the City's grants review team approved the Stormwater Department's request to apply for HCD grant funds for the Project.

K. The Office of the City Attorney prepared this Resolution based on the information provided by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete and accurate.

ACTION ITEMS

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of San Diego:

1. The Mayor, or their designee, is authorized to take all necessary actions to submit an application to HCD to secure \$11,987,501 in 2024 Disaster Recovery Infrastructure/ MIT-RIPP funds, for CIP ACC00001, Stormwater Green Infrastructure CIP (B-19095, Streamview Drive Green Infrastructure) to support administration, project management, design and construction.

2. The Mayor, or their designee, is authorized to execute a Grant Agreement and any amendments thereto.

3. The Mayor, or their designee, is authorized to execute all additional documents and take all necessary or appropriate actions to administer, monitor, manage, and ensure compliance with the Grant Agreement.

4. The Mayor, or their designee, is authorized to execute agreements with third parties to implement the Grant Agreement or the City's use of the Grant Funds, as appropriate.

5. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to accept, appropriate, and expend the Grant Funds in an amount not to exceed \$11,987,501 upon receipt of a fully executed Grant Agreement.

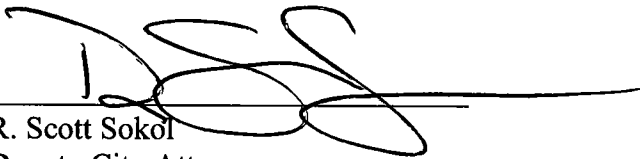
6. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to increase the Capital Improvement Program Budget in CIP ACC00001, Stormwater Green Infrastructure CIP (B-19095, Streamview Drive Green Infrastructure) and to appropriate and expend an amount not to exceed \$11,987,501 within Fund 600000, GRANT FUND-FEDERAL, contingent upon receipt of a fully executed Grant Agreement.

7. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to establish a special interest-bearing account for the Grant Funds, if required, the proceeds of which will be expended for any eligible uses identified in the Grant Agreement.

8. Existing Resolution R-316613 is hereby repealed.

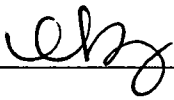
