A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
SAN DIEGO DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE
MUNICIPAL PRIMARY ELECTION AND MUNICIPAL
SPECIAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO
ON JUNE 2, 2026.

RECITALS

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Resolution based on the following:

A. A Municipal Primary Election was held in the City of San Diego on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, under the provisions of San Diego Ordinance O-22029 (Jan. 12, 2026), to elect candidates to the offices of San Diego Councilmember for Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8, respectively.

B. A Municipal Special Election was held in the City of San Diego on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, under the provisions of San Diego Ordinance No. O-22030 (Jan. 12, 2026), to submit to the qualified voters of the City of San Diego one ballot measure, described as follows: one measure regarding whether to amend the San Diego Municipal Code by amending Chapter 3, Article 2, by adding Division 1, sections 32.0101 through 32.0103 relating to a non-primary (empty) homes tax.

C. The measure, as stated in the ordinance placing it on the ballot, is:

MEASURE A NON-PRIMARY HOMES TAX. Shall a measure to preserve homes for San Diego residents, by taxing non-primary homes (residential properties vacant more than 182 days per year), excluding owner-occupied primary residences and long-term rentals, at \$8,000 in 2027 and \$10,000 in subsequent years with annual inflation adjustments, with higher rates for corporate-owned properties, generating up to \$24 million annually for city services, with annual independent audits, until ended by voters, be adopted? D. San Diego Charter section 10 directs that for elective offices, the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes in the Municipal Primary Election are to be declared as such, and then will advance to the Municipal General Election for the office.

E. The City Clerk has received from the County of San Diego Registrar of Voters a copy of the certificate canvassing the returns of the Municipal Primary Election and the Municipal Special Election.

F. A canvass of these elections has been completed and the City Clerk has certified the results to the Council.

G. The Office of the City Attorney has drafted this resolution based on the information provided by City staff, including information provided by affected third parties and verified by City staff, with the understanding that this information is complete, true, and accurate.

H. Declaring the results of these elections, as certified by the County of San Diego Registrar of Voters and the City Clerk, is a ministerial act required by California Elections Code section 10263 and, therefore, is not subject to veto by the Mayor.

ACTION ITEMS

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the Council finds and determines, pursuant to the provisions of San Diego Municipal Code section 27.0409, as follows:

1. The City of San Diego had 836,714 registered voters eligible to vote in the June 2, 2026 Municipal Primary Election and Municipal Special Election. The total number of votes cast in the City for various district races ranged from a low of 19,150 to a high of 42,477 votes, for a total of 114,620 votes.

2. The total vote received by each municipal candidate at the Municipal Primary Election is as follows:

A. FOR COUNCIL DISTRICT 2 (four-year term)

Richard Bailey and Nicole Crosby are hereby declared to be the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes and will advance to the Municipal General Election for the office of Councilmember, District No. 2.

B. FOR COUNCIL DISTRICT 4 (four-year term)

HENRY FOSTER III	9,138 VOTES (40.73%)
MARTHA ABRAHAM	9,126 VOTES (40.67%)
JOHNNY LEE DANG	4,174 VOTES (18.60%)
Total	22,438 VOTES (100%)

Henry Foster III and Martha Abraham are hereby declared to be the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes and will advance to the Municipal General Election for the office of Councilmember, District No. 4.

C. FOR COUNCIL DISTRICT 6 (four-year term)

KENT LEE	17,964 VOTES (58.79%)
MARK POWELL	12,591 VOTES (41.21%)
Total	30,555 VOTES (100%)

Kent Lee and Mark Powell are hereby declared to be the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes and will advance to the Municipal General Election for the office of Councilmember, District No. 6.

D. FOR COUNCIL DISTRICT 8 (four-year term)

ANTONIO MARTINEZ	5,375 VOTES (28.07%)
GERARDO RAMIREZ	4,636 VOTES (24.21%)
VENUS MOLINA	4,334 VOTES (22.63%)
RAFAEL PEREZ	3,536 VOTES (18.46%)
KENIA PERAZA (Write-in candidate)	1,256 VOTES (6.56%)
MIKE OCHOA (Write-in candidate)	13 VOTES (0.07%)
Total	19,150 VOTES (100%)

Antonio Martinez and Gerardo Ramirez are hereby declared to be the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes and will advance to the Municipal General Election for the office of Councilmember, District No. 8.

3. The number of votes cast in the City for and against the Measure which appeared on the ballot as Measure A – Non-Primary Homes Tax, and the total number of votes cast upon the Measure, are as follows:

MEASURE A

FOR	155,050 VOTES (46.85%)
AGAINST	175,898 VOTES (53.15%)
Total	330,948 VOTES (100%)

This measure required a majority vote to pass. Measure A did not receive a majority of votes of the qualified voters in the City voting on the measure and is hereby declared to have failed.

4. The number of votes cast in each precinct for each candidate, and for and against each measure, is recorded in the Elections Return Book, which book is authorized and is considered to be a part of the record of this Council.

5. The City Clerk shall make public the results of the canvass of the election by publication of a copy of this resolution.

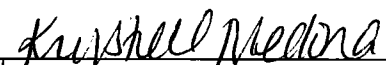

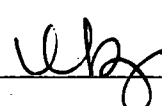
