A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT APPROVING THE AMENDMENT OF SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY'S EXISTING ELECTRICAL LINE EASEMENT LOCATED IN MISSION BAY PARK ON A PORTION OF CITY-OWNED REAL PROPERTY IDENTIFIED AS ASSESSOR'S PARCEL NUMBER 435-480-17 IS CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT UNDER TITLE 14 CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS SECTIONS 15301, 15302, AND 15304.

RECITALS

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Resolution based on the following:

A. The Council will consider approval of an amendment to the existing electrical line easement granted by the City of San Diego (City) to San Diego Gas and Electric Company (SDG&E), and recorded with the San Diego County Recorder as Document No. 2019-0132425, to expand the easement area by approximately 31,896 square feet on City-owned real property in Mission Bay Park identified as a portion of Assessor's Parcel Number 435-480-17 related to SDG&E's efforts to replace and underground electrical transmission infrastructure (Project).

B. The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), California Public Resources Code (Code) sections 21000-21189.91, provides in Code section 21083 that the California Office of Planning and Research will promulgate, and the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency will adopt, guidelines for implementation of CEQA. The California Office of Planning and Research promulgated, and the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency adopted, the guidelines for implementation of CEQA set forth in Title 14 California Code of Regulations sections 15000 through 15387 (CEQA Guidelines).

C. Code section 21084 requires the CEQA Guidelines to include a list of classes of projects that have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and are exempt from the provisions of CEQA. CEQA Guidelines sections 15300 through 15333 list classes of projects that have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and declared to be exempt from preparation of environmental documents under CEQA.

D. The Council has considered the written record related to the Project and all public comments about the potential environmental effects of the Project. The Council, using its independent judgment, has determined that the Project is categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA under CEQA Guidelines section 15301 (titled “Existing Facilities”) on the basis that SDG&E has operated existing electrical transmission infrastructure area since at least 2019 and that the Project will not create foreseeable changes that will cause a significant impact on the environment.

E. The Council, using its independent judgment, has further determined that the Project is categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA under CEQA Guidelines section 15302 (titled “Replacement or Reconstruction”) on the basis that the Project will involve replacement or reconstruction of an existing utility system and/or facilities involving no change in use.

F. The Council, using its independent judgment, has further determined that the Project is categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA under CEQA Guidelines section 15304 (titled “Minor Alterations to Land”) on the basis that the Project will involve minor trenching and backfilling where the surface is restored.

G. No exception to the application of a categorical exemption set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 applies to the Project.

H. The Office of the City Attorney prepared this Resolution based on the information provided by City staff (including information provided by affected third parties and verified by City staff), with the understanding that this information is complete and accurate.

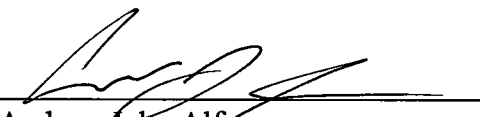
ACTION ITEMS

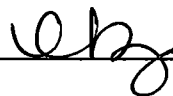
