

Glen W. Sparrow is now professor emeritus at the School of Public Administration and Urban Studies, San Diego State University, San Diego, California. He received his Ph. D. in Government from Claremont Graduate School in 1976. His areas of specialization include state and local government management, metropolitan regional governance, intergovernmental relations and border governance. In addition to teaching he has: been Executive Director of the Sacramento and San Francisco California Charter Commissions, spent a year on the staff of a member of the California Assembly and a year as staff to a member of the San Diego City Council. He has also provided consulting assistance to cities and counties in California, in the areas of incorporation, fiscal management and public-private partnerships.

Sparrow has been invited as visiting professor for universities in Hong Kong, Canada, Hungary, Mexico and Peoples Republic of China. In 1986-87, while a Fulbright Professor at the Chinese University of Hong Kong, he began the study of international boundaries, an interest he continued to pursue upon his return to SDSU His current research agenda involves the governance of international borders with special attention to the San Diego/Tijuana border.

Sparrow retired in 2002 but teaches during the fall semester.
