SUBJECT: Amendments to SDMC 63.0102, Use of Public Parks and Beaches Regulated – Dog Off-Leash Areas and Dogs in Public Parks, Plazas, Beaches, and Beach Areas

REFERENCE: Report No: 10-112

REQUESTED ACTION:

Amend San Diego Municipal Code 63.0102, Use of Public Parks and Beaches Regulated, as follows:

1. Change terminology of "designated dog exercise area" to be referenced as "dog off-leash area" and,
2. Dog Off-Leash Area – Add section 63.0102(c) to provide specific municipal codes to support some of the current rules/regulations within dog off-leash areas and dog training areas; and,
3. Dogs in Public Parks, Plazas, Beaches, and Beach Areas - Add a section 63.0102 (d) to establish specific municipal codes for rules/regulations of dogs in parks, plazas, beaches, and beach areas within the City of San Diego.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Amend San Diego Municipal Code 63.0102, Use of Public Parks and Beaches Regulated, as requested.

BACKGROUND:

On September 22, 2010 Report No. 10-112 regarding amendments to SDMC 63.0102 was presented to the Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee. Prior to that, the proposal had been presented to numerous Park and Recreation Department park advisory groups for their endorsement. Of the sixty-two (62) groups which reported results, sixty-one (61) supported the proposed amendments. During public testimony on September 22, 2010, seven (7) persons spoke in opposition to the proposed amendments. Of the seven (7) persons, two (2) persons indicated that they represented organizations, the San Diego County Wildlife Federation and the Sporting Dog Council of San Diego. As a result of their opposition, PS&NS Committee directed

the Park and Recreation Department (Department) staff to conduct additional research regarding five (5) topics:

- Regulations for dogs at County of San Diego Parks
- City of San Diego limits for dogs per household
- Acreage for City of San Diego Dog Off-Leash Areas and applicable restrictions based upon acreage
- Techniques to maintain control of dogs
- Commercial Permits for dog walker businesses

Additionally, staff was requested to outreach to professional pet sitters/walkers and dog training organizations.

The following information is provided in response to the five (5) topics of interest:

- The County of San Diego does not have any designated dog off leash areas within the County park system. Dogs are allowed in many County parks with certain exceptions and restrictions. Dogs must be on a leash no longer than six (6) feet at all times and dogs are NOT allowed off leash. Dogs are not allowed at Quail Gardens or Volcan Mountain Open Space Preserve.
- The City of San Diego has identified six (6) dogs per household as the maximum number allowed. The limit of dogs per household varied in cities throughout the County. In most instances, there was a correlation to the number of dogs permitted per household associated with the classification of the residential zone.
- City of San Diego designated Dog Off-Leash Areas range in size from .44 acres at Capehart Park to 381.91 acres at Fiesta Island. Of the 381.91 Fiesta Island acres, approximately 94.00 acres are fenced. Of the fifteen (15) Off-Leash Areas, nine (9) are 1.32 acres or less. (Attachments 1 and 2) The Advisories and Rules/Regulations for the Off-Leash Areas were adopted by the City Council in June 2002. (Attachment 3) The five (5) Advisories and ten (10) Rules/Regulations apply to all of the sites with the following exceptions:
 - Dog Beach, Dusty Rhodes Neighborhood Park and Fiesta Island are excluded from the prohibition of Dog Training Classes in Off-Leash Areas.
 - The need to fill holes dug by dogs at Dog Beach and Fiesta Island was eliminated.
 - Each user may have a maximum of two (2) dogs off-leash at the same time at Grape Street Dog-Off-Leash Area.

- o Dusty Rhodes Neighborhood Park, Maddox Neighborhood Park, Rancho Bernardo Community Park and Rancho Penasquitos Linear Park limit three (3) dogs off-leash per person per visit.

It should be noted that while the Rules/Regulations are applicable to all of the Off-Leash areas with the exceptions noted, the postings are not identical in nature. Some areas have adopted additional conditions for use of the area.

- Dogs must be under voice, whistle, or hand signal control.
- The Department staff will consider and review a new fee to address commercial use of park land by dog walkers/pet sitters for possible inclusion in the Park and Recreation Department Fee Schedule.
- Staff sent twenty-eight (28) Dog Off-Leash Stakeholders (Stakeholders) the September 22, 2010 PS&NS report, a list of the City of San Diego Dog Off-Leash Areas and applicable acreage, Dog Training Permit Fees in the current adopted Park and Recreation Department Fiscal Year 2011 Fee Schedule, as well as City Manager Revised Recommendations and City Council Actions pertaining to SDMC 63.0102.

The Stakeholders were advised that City Attorney's Office and Department staff have met with San Diego County Animal Services staff on the proposed changes to the SDMC and the support that they may provide. The San Diego County Animal Services staff were amenable to have the SDMC incorporate language that gives them concurrent jurisdiction and supplemental enforcement.

Input was solicited from Stakeholders and an invitation to attend a meeting to share their perspectives, resources, and knowledge base was extended. On November 18, 2010 a meeting was held. In attendance were representatives from the Office of the City Attorney, County of San Diego Animal Services, Park and Recreation Department, San Diego County Wildlife Federation, Sporting Dog Council of San Diego, professional Dog Walkers/Pet Sitters, and Rancho Bernardo Dog Off-Leash Area.

The most recent Dog Off-Leash Area comments received were provided to the meeting attendees. As a result of additional input received and the discussion that ensued, staff has modified a portion of our initial recommendation. Due to the large size of the Fiesta Island Dog Off- Leash Area it is recognized that there is an ability to accommodate a greater number of dogs than the typical Off-Leash Area. As such, the Department is recommending that the dogs allowed off-leash per person will be six (6) for this area, as opposed to the recommendation for all other Dog Off- Leash Areas which is recommended to be three (3) dogs per person.

The Stakeholders were also advised that the Department is pursuing a fee to address commercial permits for dog walker/pet sitter businesses.

It is the purpose and intent to amend SDMC 63.0102, Use of Public Parks and Beaches Regulated to regulate designated dog off-leash areas and dogs in parks, plazas, beaches, and beach areas within the City of San Diego in the interest of protecting the enjoyment and safety of the public in the use of these facilities. The amendments to SDMC 63.0102 require City Council review and approval.

Change Terminology- Current terminology in SDMC 63.0102, Use of Public Parks and Beaches Regulated, identifies a dog off-leash area as a "designated dog exercise area". For greater clarification and consistency it is recommended that "designated dog exercise area" be changed and referenced as "dog off-leash area or dog training area".

Dog Off-Leash Area or Dog Training Area- To increase the ability to regulate dog off-leash areas, it is recommended that some of the rules/regulations established in May of 2001 and adopted by the City Council in June of 2002 be codified in the San Diego Municipal Code. In addition, it is recommended that a three (3) dog limit per person at anytime be implemented to assist in the control of dogs and of the dog off-leash area environment with the exception of Fiesta Island where a six (6) dog limit per person is recommended. The following regulations would be added as section 63.0102(c):

- **Three Dog Limit.** With the exception of Fiesta Island, it is unlawful for an owner or person with custody, care, charge, control, or possession of a dog, or both, to have more than three (3) dogs within a designated dog off-leash area or dog training area at anytime. Six (6) dogs per person are allowed at Fiesta Island.
- **Dog Supervision.** It is unlawful for an owner or person with custody, care, charge, control or possession of a dog, or both, to abandon or otherwise leave any off-leash

dog unattended or unsupervised within any designated dog off-leash area or dog training area at any time.

- **Female Dogs in Estrus.** It is unlawful for a dog owner or person with custody, care, charge, control, or possession of a dog, or both, to have a female dog in estrus (heat cycle) within a dog off-leash area or dog training area.
- **Current Dog License Required.** It is unlawful for a dog owner or person with custody, care, charge, control, or possession of a dog, or both, to have a dog within a designated off-leash area or dog training area without a current and valid dog license as required by San Diego County Code Section 62.620 and adopted by San Diego Municipal Code Section 44.0300.

Dogs in Public Parks, Plazas, Beaches, and Beach Areas- It is also recommended that a new section (d) be added to establish rules/regulations for dogs in all public parks, plazas, beaches, and beach areas within the City of San Diego. Section (d) would include the following:

- It is unlawful for a dog owner or person with custody, care, charge, control, or possession of a dog, or both, to have a dog over the age of four (4) months within a public park or plaza or public beach or beach area without a current dog license as required by law. This provision shall not apply to non-residents visiting for less than thirty (30) days.
- It is unlawful in the event of a dog bite that results in injury requiring medical care to a person or another dog, for the owner or person with custody, care, charge, control or possession of a dog, or both, to fail to provide at the time of injury his or her full name, correct dog license information, telephone number, mailing address, and driver's license number.

The Department staff sought input and endorsement from a number of dog off-leash area stakeholders, and Park and Recreation Department Advisory Groups. Through this eleven (11) month public outreach, the Department gained further insight that has enabled us to provide a comprehensive final proposal to the City Council. As a second phase of dog off-leash areas, the Department staff plans to review policies and procedures for the siting and design of future dog off-leash areas.

SUMMARY:

Amend Chapter 6, Article 3, Division 1 of the San Diego Municipal Code by amending Section 63.0102(b)(2)(c) and adding Sections 63.0102(c) and 63.0102(d), all relating to Dog Off-Leash and Dog Training Areas, and to Dogs in Public Parks, Plazas, Beaches, and Beach Areas.

FISCAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Funding in the amount of \$10,500 is required for new signage which is available in the Park and Recreation Department FY 2011 budget.

COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION AND PUBLIC OUTREACH EFFORTS:

Beginning in April 2010 the Draft Proposed Amendments to SDMC 63.0102, Use of Public Parks and Beaches Regulated was presented to numerous Park and Recreation Department park advisory groups for endorsement. The Balboa Park Committee, Community Parks I Area Committee, Community Parks II Area Committee, Mission Bay Park Committee, and the Open Space Advisory Committee all endorsed the draft proposed amendments as presented.

On July 17, 2010 the Park and Recreation Board voted unanimously to recommend amending San Diego Municipal Code 63.010, Dog Off-Leash Areas, Dogs in Public Parks, Beaches, and Beach Areas.

On November 18, 2010 an additional meeting was held with Stakeholders to discuss increasing the three (3) dog limit to a six (6) dog limit, dog training activities, the capability of pet sitters to effectively manage multiple dogs, and commercial activities on park land.

**ADVISORIES AND RULES/REGULATIONS
FOR POSTING AT OFF-LEASH AREAS
JUNE 11, 2002 CITY COUNCIL APPROVAL**

Advisories

1. Enter at your own risk.
2. Users of the Off-Leash Area accept liability for actions of their dogs.
3. Dog training classes are not allowed in Off-Leash Areas. (Excludes Dog Beach, Dusty Rhodes Neighborhood Park and Fiesta Island)
4. Violations of the regulations may result in revocation of the Off-Leash Area designation and/or prosecution under applicable law.
5. Contact phone numbers for: Park and Recreation Department, County Animal Control (County of San Diego Department of Animal Services) and San Diego Police Department.

Rules/Regulations

1. LEASH dog while entering and leaving the Off-Leash Area.
2. Aggressive dogs, Declared Dangerous Dogs, and dogs in heat are prohibited.
3. Dog must be removed from the Off-Leash Area if aggressive.
4. Dog must have current license/vaccination.
5. Dog owner must remain in Off-Leash Area with dog.
6. Dog owner must have leash on hand at all times for each dog.
7. Dog must be under voice, whistle or hand signal control.
8. Keep small children and infants under strict supervision.
9. PICK UP after your dog.
10. Fill any hole your dog digs. (Excludes Dog Beach and Fiesta Island)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 3, DIVISION 1 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 63.0102(b)(2)(C) AND ADDING SECTIONS 63.0102(c) AND 63.0102(d), ALL RELATING TO DOG OFF-LEASH AND DOG TRAINING AREAS AND TO DOGS IN PUBLIC PARKS, PLAZAS, BEACHES, AND BEACH AREAS.

WHEREAS, in May 2001, the Park and Recreation Department (Department) established criteria for the informal regulation of dog off-leash areas through a volunteer, advisory committee approved by the City Council known as the Ad Hoc Off-Leash Dog Committee (Committee); and

WHEREAS, the Committee developed policies and rules which have been posted on signs at dog off-leash areas throughout the City of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, these policies and rules do not have the force and effect of law and therefore cannot currently be enforced except by voluntary cooperation; and

WHEREAS, the Department has received frequent complaints related to dog off-leash areas including, but not limited to, the inability of people to control multiple dogs at one time; and

WHEREAS, the Department has conducted extensive public outreach by seeking input and endorsement from numerous dog off-leash stakeholders and Department advisory groups on a proposed amendment to San Diego Municipal Code section 63.0102 which codifies the policies and rules developed by the Committee; and

WHEREAS, on July 15, 2010, the Department presented the proposed amendment to San Diego Municipal Code section 63.0102 to Park and Recreation Board which recommended it for approval by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, on September 22, 2010, the Department presented the proposed amendment to San Diego Municipal Code section 63.0102 to the Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee, which requested that the Department meet with community stakeholders in attendance who voiced concerns about the proposed limit on the number of dogs within dog off-leash and dog training areas; and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2010, the Department met with the concerned community stakeholders in an effort to address their concerns; and

WHEREAS, on _____, 2011, the Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee voted to recommend the proposed amendment to San Diego Municipal Code section 63.0102 and forwarded it to the City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 6, Article 3, Division 1 of the San Diego Municipal Code is amended by amending section 63.0102 to read as follows:

§63.0102 Use of Public Parks and Beaches Regulated

- (a) [No change in text.]
- (b) It is unlawful for any person within any public park or plaza or public beach or beach areas within the City of San Diego to do any of the acts enumerated in Section 63.0102(b).
 - (1) [No change in text.]

(2) Loose Animals. It is unlawful to bring, leave, turn loose or allow to go free any animal, fowl, or bird of any kind in or upon any City-owned park or plaza; provided, however, that Section 63.0102(b)(2) does not apply to:

(A) [No change in text.]

(B) [No change in text.]

(C) Dogs which are in special areas of parks designated and posted by the Park and Recreation Director as dog off-leash areas or dog training areas and so long as the regulations of the Park and Recreation Director with respect to the use of such areas are followed.

(i) Implied Consent. The presence of a dog in a designated dog off-leash area or dog training area shall constitute implied consent of the person either owning or controlling the dog to the regulations imposed by the Park and Recreation Director.

(ii) Liability and Indemnification. The presence of a dog in a designated dog off-leash area or dog training area shall constitute a waiver of liability, on behalf of the person either owning or controlling the dog, to the City of San Diego, as well as an agreement and undertaking to protect, indemnify,

defend, and hold harmless the City of San Diego for any injury or damage caused by the dog.

(3) through (28) [No change in text.]

- (c) Dog Off Leash and Dog Training Areas. It is unlawful for an owner or person with custody, care, charge, control, or possession of a dog, or both, to do any of the following:
- (1) Have more than three (3) dogs within a designated dog off-leash area or dog training area at any time; provided, however, that on Fiesta Island an owner or person with custody, care, charge, control, or possession of a dog, or both, shall have no more than six (6) dogs.
 - (2) Abandon or otherwise leave any off-leash dog unattended or unsupervised within any designated dog off-leash area or dog training area at any time.
 - (3) Have a female dog in estrus (heat cycle) within a dog off-leash area or dog training area at any time.
 - (4) Have a dog within a designated off-leash area or dog training area without a current and valid dog license as required by San Diego County Code section 62.620 and adopted by San Diego Municipal Code section 44.0300.
- (d) Dogs in Public Parks, Plazas, Beaches, and Beach Areas. It is unlawful for a dog owner or person with custody, care, charge, control, or possession of a dog, or both, within any public park or plaza or public beach or beach area within the City of San Diego to do any of the following:

- (1) Have a dog without a current dog license as required by San Diego County Code section 62.620 and adopted by San Diego Municipal Code section 44.0300. This provision shall not apply to nonresidents visiting for less than thirty (30) days.
- (2) In the event of a dog bite that results in injury requiring medical care to a person or another dog, fail to provide to the injured person or owner or custodian of the injured dog, at the time of the injury, his or her full name, correct dog license information, telephone number, mailing address, and driver's license number.

Section 2. That a full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to its passage, a written or printed copy having been made available to the City Council and the public prior to the day of its passage.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.

- (1) Have more than three (3) dogs within a designated dog off-leash area or dog training area at any time; provided, however, that on Fiesta Island an owner or person with custody, care, charge, control, or possession of a dog, or both, shall have no more than six (6) dogs.
- (2) Abandon or otherwise leave any off-leash dog unattended or unsupervised within any designated dog off-leash area or dog training area at any time.
- (3) Have a female dog in estrus (heat cycle) within a dog off-leash area or dog training area at any time.
- (4) Have a dog within a designated off-leash area or dog training area without a current and valid dog license as required by San Diego County Code section 62.620 and adopted by San Diego Municipal Code section 44.0300.

(d) Dogs in Public Parks, Plazas, Beaches, and Beach Areas. It is unlawful for a dog owner or person with custody, care, charge, control, or possession of a dog, or both, within any public park or plaza or public beach or beach area within the City of San Diego to do any of the following:

- (1) Have a dog without a current dog license as required by San Diego County Code section 62.620 and adopted by San Diego Municipal Code section

44.0300. This provision shall not apply to nonresidents visiting for less than thirty (30) days.

- (2) In the event of a dog bite that results in injury requiring medical care to a person or another dog, fail to provide to the injured person or owner or custodian of the injured dog, at the time of the injury, his or her full name, correct dog license information, telephone number, mailing address, and driver's license number.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 3, DIVISION 1 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 63.0102(b)(2)(C) AND ADDING SECTIONS 63.0102(c) AND 63.0102(d), ALL RELATING TO DOG OFF-LEASH AND DOG TRAINING AREAS AND TO DOGS IN PUBLIC PARKS, PLAZAS, BEACHES, AND BEACH AREAS.

This ordinance amends Chapter 6, Article 3, Division 1 of the San Diego Municipal Code (SDMC) by amending SDMC section 63.0102(b)(2)(C) and adding new SDMC sections 63.0102(c) and 63.0102(d). The amendment to SDMC section 63.0102(b)(2)(C) consists of revising "designated dog exercise area" to "dog off-leash area". The addition of SDMC section 63.0102(c) establishes a three dog limit within any dog off-leash or dog training area with the exception of Fiesta Island, which has a six dog limit, and prohibits female dogs in estrus from being within any such areas at any time. It also requires that an owner or person with custody, care, charge, control, or possession of a dog to supervise and attend to their dogs at all times while in a dog off-leash or dog training area. It also prohibits dogs from being in dog off-leash and dog training areas without a valid and current dog license as set forth in the San Diego County Code. The addition of SDMC section 63.0102(d) requires a current and valid dog license in accordance with the San Diego County Code for dogs within any public park or plaza, beach, or beach area. SDMC section 63.0102(d) also requires the owner or person with custody, care, charge, control, or possession of a dog to provide contact information in the event that a dog bite results in injury requiring medical care to a person or another dog.

This ordinance contains a notice that a full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to its passage, a written or printed copy having been available to the City Council and the public prior to the day of its passage.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.
