STAR/PAL brings youth & law enforcement together today...to build safer communities tomorrow.

STAR/PAL (Sports Training, Academics, Recreation/Police Athletic League) is a nonprofit organization that provides over 10,000 youth services annually in inner-city neighborhoods throughout the city and county of San Diego. STAR/PAL offers free educational, athletic, and recreational programs which focus on promoting youth safety, positive life choices, and academic success. STAR/PAL program directors are officers from the San Diego Police & County Probation Departments. These dedicated officers coordinate unique programs for underserved youth, with the assistance of additional law enforcement and community volunteers. By bringing youth and law enforcement officers together in this manner, STAR/PAL helps build safer communities in the future.

STAR/PAL HISTORY

Initially two separate entities, the San Diego PAL Chapter was founded in 1988 and primarily served county areas whereas the STAR organization came into existence in 1993 to focus its programmatic efforts within city boundaries. The two organizations merged in April of 1998, representing the alignment of city, county, and community efforts. The unification of programs, staff, volunteers, and the Board of Directors sought to ensure that all youth in the region have similar opportunities to participate and reap the benefits of youth programming with law enforcement officers, firefighters and community leaders. All STAR/PAL Program Directors are law enforcement officers who educate youth about the dangers of juvenile crime and violence.

THE STAR/PAL FACILITY

STAR/PAL's organizational infrastructure and programmatic focus exemplify police and community collaboration. By having built its facility in Colina Del Sol Park surrounded by five neighborhood schools in City Heights, STAR/PAL offers a sense of safety to hundreds of youth who walk to and from school. Through a wide array of on-site and off-site youth programs, STAR/PAL promotes crime prevention, community building, and leadership development, all under the tutelage of police and probation officers. By having law enforcement personnel available to deter and address juvenile crime activity ranging from truancy and graffiti to gang activity and assaults, STAR/PAL has provided a resource for all youth and families that want to safely enjoy their community park.

STAR/PAL's Youth Center

During the school year, hundreds of youth walk through Colina Del Sol Park in East City Heights to five surrounding schools. STAR/PAL built its facility in this community park (which had historically been plagued with crime issues) in order to provide a safe haven as well as offer free after-school programming to neighborhood youth. All STAR/PAL Program Directors are law enforcement officers who make themselves available to work with youth center participants, who are between 9 and 14 years of age.



In partnership with local universities, STAR/PAL facilitates having college students tutor these youth at the center, enabling them to better their academic performance while developing positive relationships with role models. Additional programs at the center focus on fitness/sports, developing effective communication skills, and crime prevention education. During school breaks, STAR/PAL's Youth Center provides a variety of field trips and activities which are designed to expose youth to new opportunities and educational experiences. *For more information regarding the STAR/PAL Youth Center, please contact Aalke Heuvelman at aheuvelman@starpal.org or 619-533-5794.*

Educational Programs



Mentoring: Students from a local City Heights elementary school are matched with active and retired law enforcement officers along with other screened volunteers for the STAR/PAL Mentoring Program. During this year-long program, mentors volunteer on a weekly basis to assist with homework and educational tutoring, as well as provide guidance for life challenges. Crime Prevention Presentations: STAR/PAL officers provide many presentations during the school year in partnership with San Diego Unified School District. The subject matter of these presentations focus on teaching students ways to prevent bullying, using drugs & alcohol, gang violence, juvenile incarceration, as well as sexual assault. *For more information, please call 619-531-2718.*

GirL-E, Leadership & Empowerment: STAR/PAL offers a 6-week curriculum for high school age girls, including those at risk of entering the juvenile justice system. Through this program, teen female participants are able to openly discuss issues related to self-esteem, healthy relationships & choices, nutrition, sexual assault prevention, as well as goal-setting. Teen-LEAP (Leadership, Empowerment, Awareness Program): This 20-session program encourages middle-school students to be effective leaders within their schools and communities. By engaging teens in new experiences which give them the tools to be leaders, the program promotes awareness about community issues as well as civic involvement to address them. Kids, Cops & Cameras: This program offers GirL-E and Teen-LEAP participants the opportunity to join professional photographers, law enforcement officers, and volunteers to learn about the art of photography and journalism. InterACTion, A Law Enforcement & Theatre Program: This 10-session program brings law enforcement officers and teaching artists from the La Jolla Playhouse together inside the classroom of local high schools. This curriculum was designed to assist students to learn the necessary tools to make positive life choices, using theater to express their thoughts and emotions about the challenges they may face in their community. Field Trips for Kids: Throughout the year, STAR/PAL receives thousands of tickets for inner-city youth to experience sporting events, theater productions, museums, and much more! Lake Fishing: STAR/PAL’s Fishing Derby is held annually in June and invites 300 youth from local City Heights schools to go fishing at their neighborhood lake. All participants receive Junior Fishing Licenses, event t-shirts, a BBQ lunch (cooked up courtesy of local firefighters), and fishing poles to take home after their day at Chollas Lake. Volunteers for this event include San Diego law enforcement officers, firefighters, San Diego Fish & Game, and the San Diego Fly Fishers Group. Outdoor Excursions: STAR/PAL offers year-round outdoor excursions for underserved youth, which includes activities such as sailing, hiking, surfing, and kayaking. Youth are taken on half-day excursions to locations throughout San Diego County, exposing them to new outdoor activities and environments while teaching them about safety precautions. Underserved youth are partnered with law enforcement officers and treated to breakfast as well as a private animal show at SeaWorld. A child then rides along with his/her partnered law enforcement officer in a police car with lights & sirens announcing their arrival at Target for a \$100 shopping trip. More than 300 law enforcement officers participate representing nearly 30 different agencies in San Diego County.
