Item 3 – Regulatory Relief Day Follow-up Working Group Matrix Update

Item Summary

The Regulatory Relief Suggestions Matrix has been revised to reflect prior Economic Development and Strategies (ED&S) Committee direction and has been updated to indicate department(s) responsible and status as of September 12, 2012.

To facilitate review, suggestions have been split into two matrices: (1) “Review Completed in 2012,” and (2) “Review Ongoing as of September 2012.”

Inclusion of a suggestion in the “Review Completed in 2012” matrix indicates that Working Group review is complete and a response has been provided in the “Working Group Comment(s)” section. This matrix also includes suggestions previously requested to be removed by the Committee (see actions below), and suggestions for which stakeholders were solicited for further information, but no response has been received.

The “Review Ongoing” matrix includes suggestions whose implementation is currently underway. An update should be provided to the Committee by the responsible department, as identified.
