POLICE DEPARTMENT GOALS & OBJECTIVES

The goal of the San Diego Police Department is to promote a peaceful, orderly environment for all persons who come to the beach and bay areas; facilitate the smooth flow of traffic in and around the area; and to rapidly and efficiently solve problems. Police personnel will enforce applicable State laws and City ordinances.

Enforcement is designed to hold the offender accountable and to encourage compliance. In order to meet these objectives officers will maintain a high profile, high enforcement posture. However, officers always have discretion to warn or issue a citation.

Northern Division Holiday Staffing

Memorial Day and Labor Day

- Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday staffing will be enhanced during the day and early evening hours at the beaches and bays.
- Friday, Saturday and Sunday staffing will be enhanced during the evening hours in the entertainment district.

July 4th

The July 4th holiday is the largest and busiest event of the year for not only the Beach community, but the City of San Diego as well. Historically, crowds have begun to gather as early as the night before the holiday.

To best facilitate our goals and objectives the Incident Command System (ICS) will be utilized over the July 4th holiday.

ICS Command Overview

Each Command Post will serve two basic functions; provide a centralized location where operations can be coordinated from and deter criminal activity by providing a substantial police presence.

July 4th Holiday Staffing

- Staffing will be enhanced at the beaches and bays starting on Tuesday, July 3rd through Wednesday, July 4th. Additional officers will be deployed on the weekends immediately before and after July 4th.
- Staffing will be enhanced in the entertainment district during the evening hours, starting on Tuesday, July 3rd through Wednesday, July 4th.
