# Overall Crime in 2012



- Overall, crime increased 6.9% when comparing 2012 to 2011.
- The overall number of crimes last year in 2011 was the lowest in 42 years; despite the increases in 2012, the number of crimes in each of the categories this year is similar to those from the early 1970s.
- Increasing crime appears to be consistent with trends in the San Diego region.

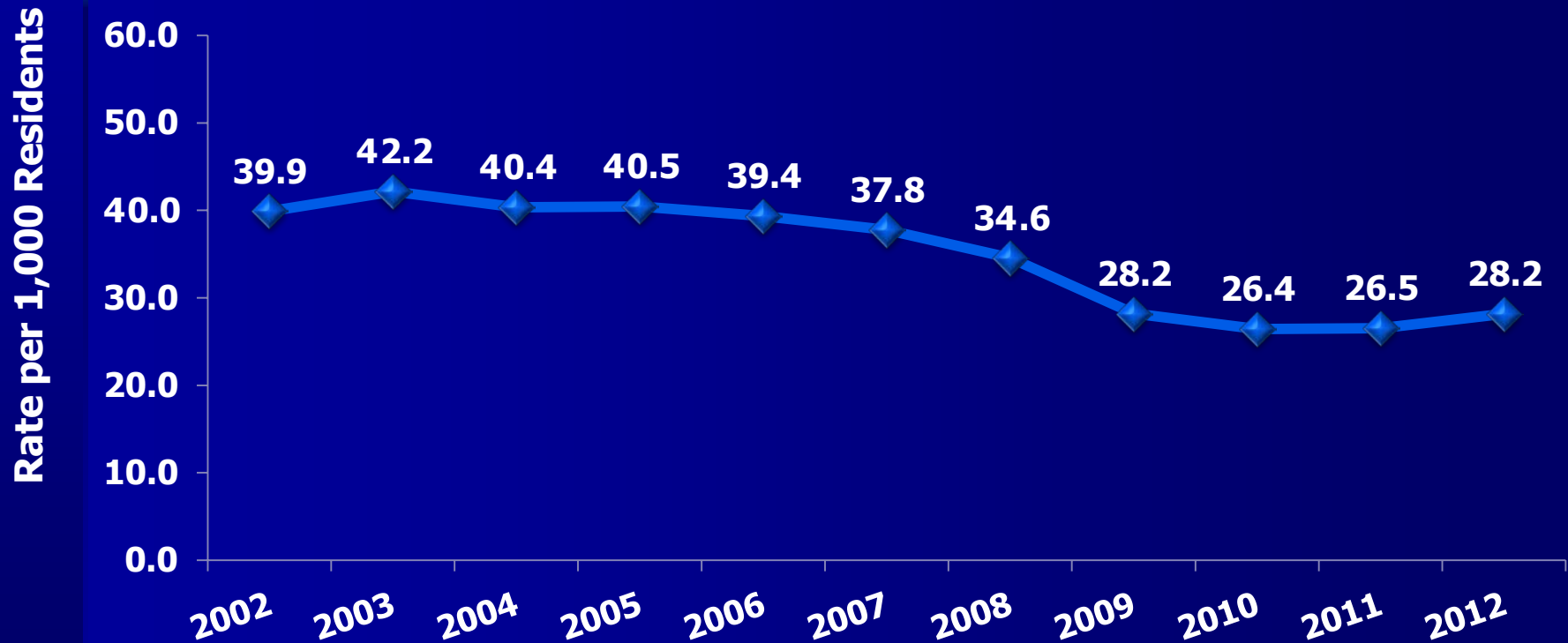

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# Violent Crimes



- In 2012, there were 5,529 violent crimes, an increase of 8.3% compared to 2011.
- 4.2 citizens out of 1,000 were victims of violent crimes.
- The 2012 crime rate (28.2 per thousand residents) is comparable to rates experienced in the early 1960s.

# Violent Crimes (cont.)

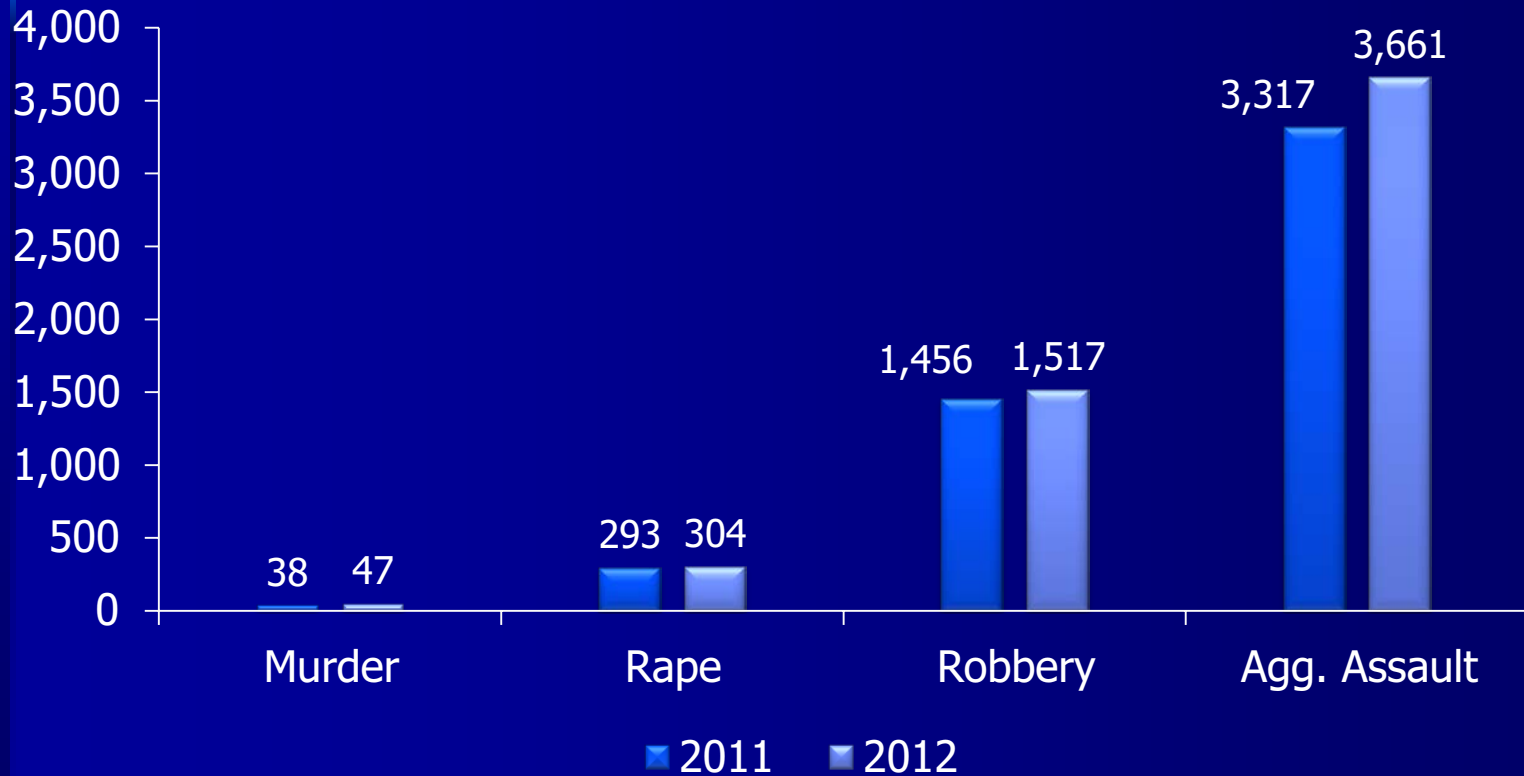


- Murders increased for the second consecutive year, from 38 cases in 2011 to 47 in 2012.
- Rapes increased slightly, by 3.8% in 2012.
- Robbery was up in 2012, by 4.2%.
- Aggravated Assaults increased 10.4% in 2012.

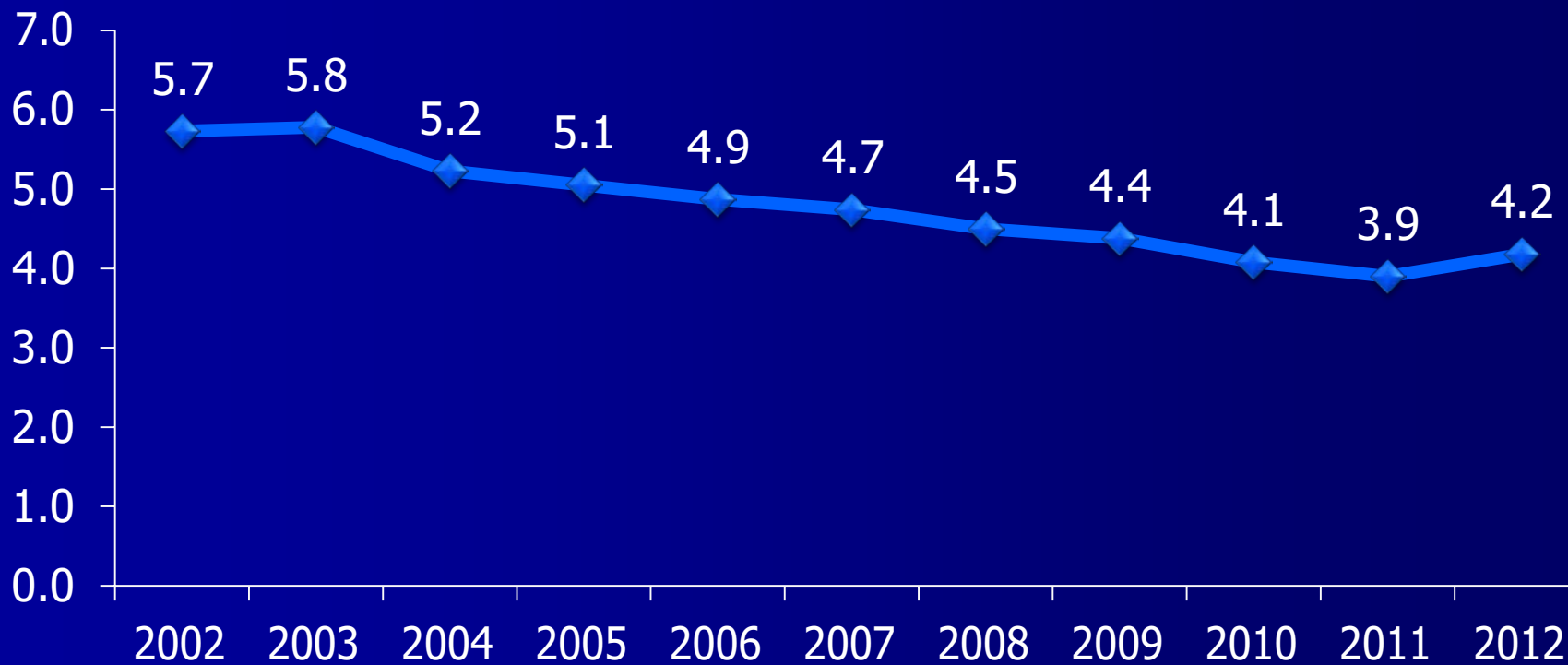
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# Violent Crime Rate Comparison



Rate per 1,000 Residents



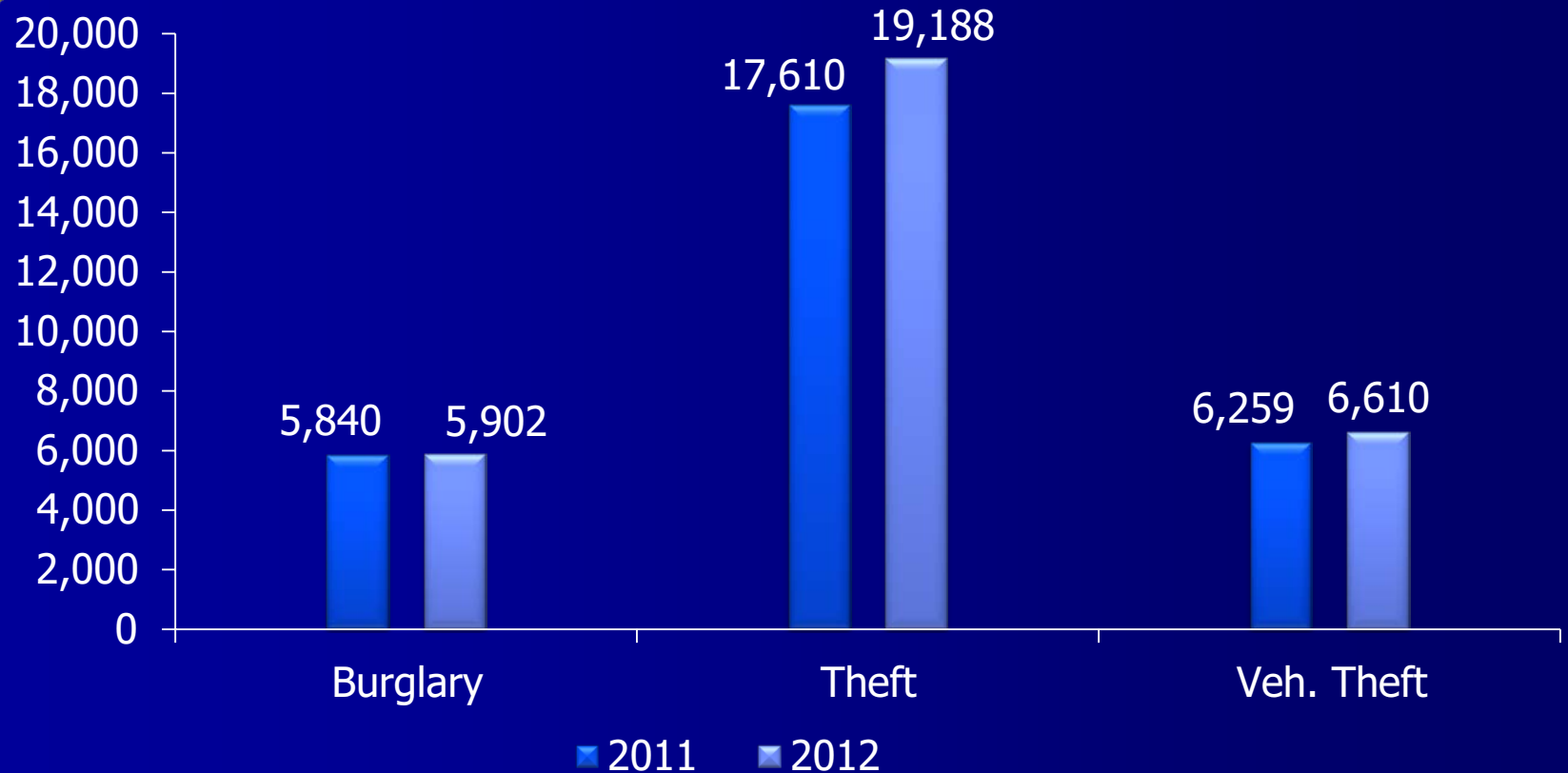
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# Property Crimes



- There were 31,700 property crimes in 2012, including burglary, theft and vehicle theft.
- Property crimes increased 6.7% from 2011.
- Theft showed the largest increase at 9.0%.
- Car prowls accounted for 43.3% of thefts in 2012.
- Residential burglaries were up 9.4%, while commercial burglaries were down 13.5%.

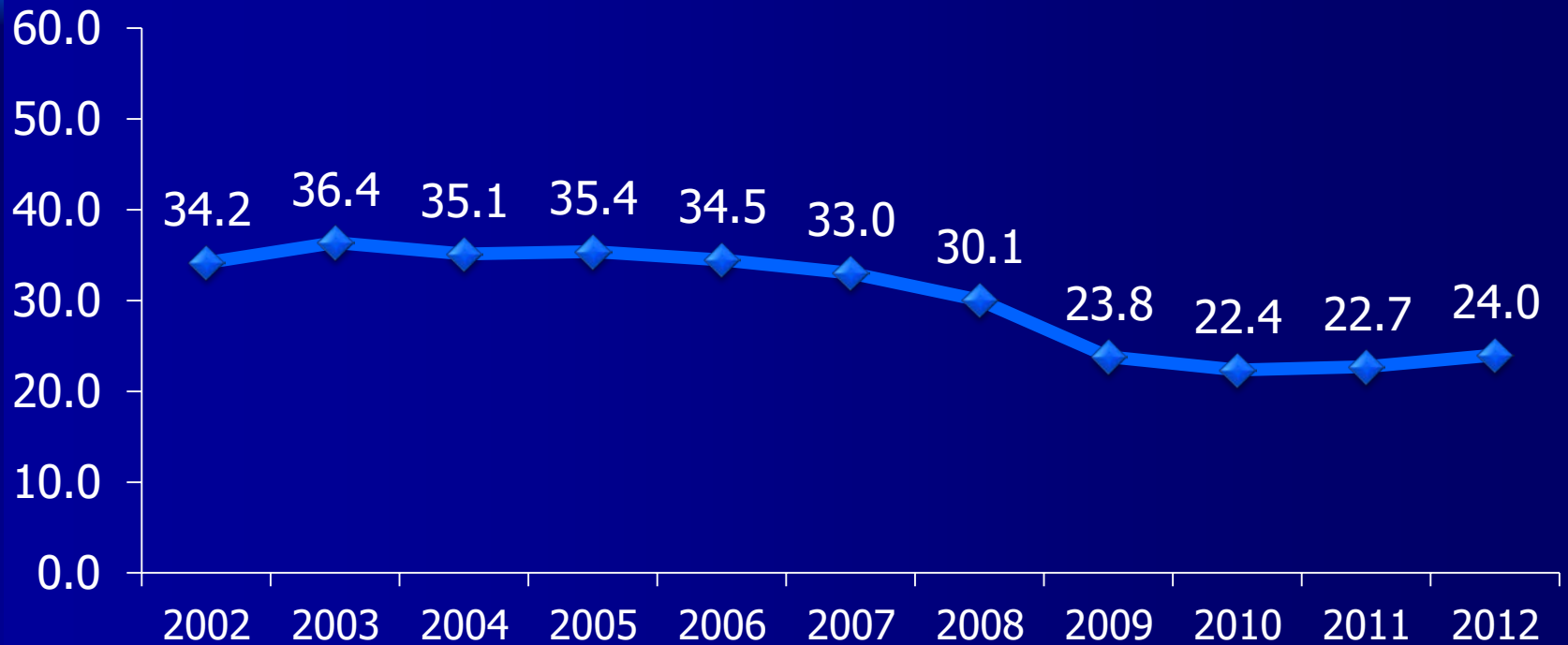


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# Property Crime Rate Comparison



Rate per 1,000 Residents



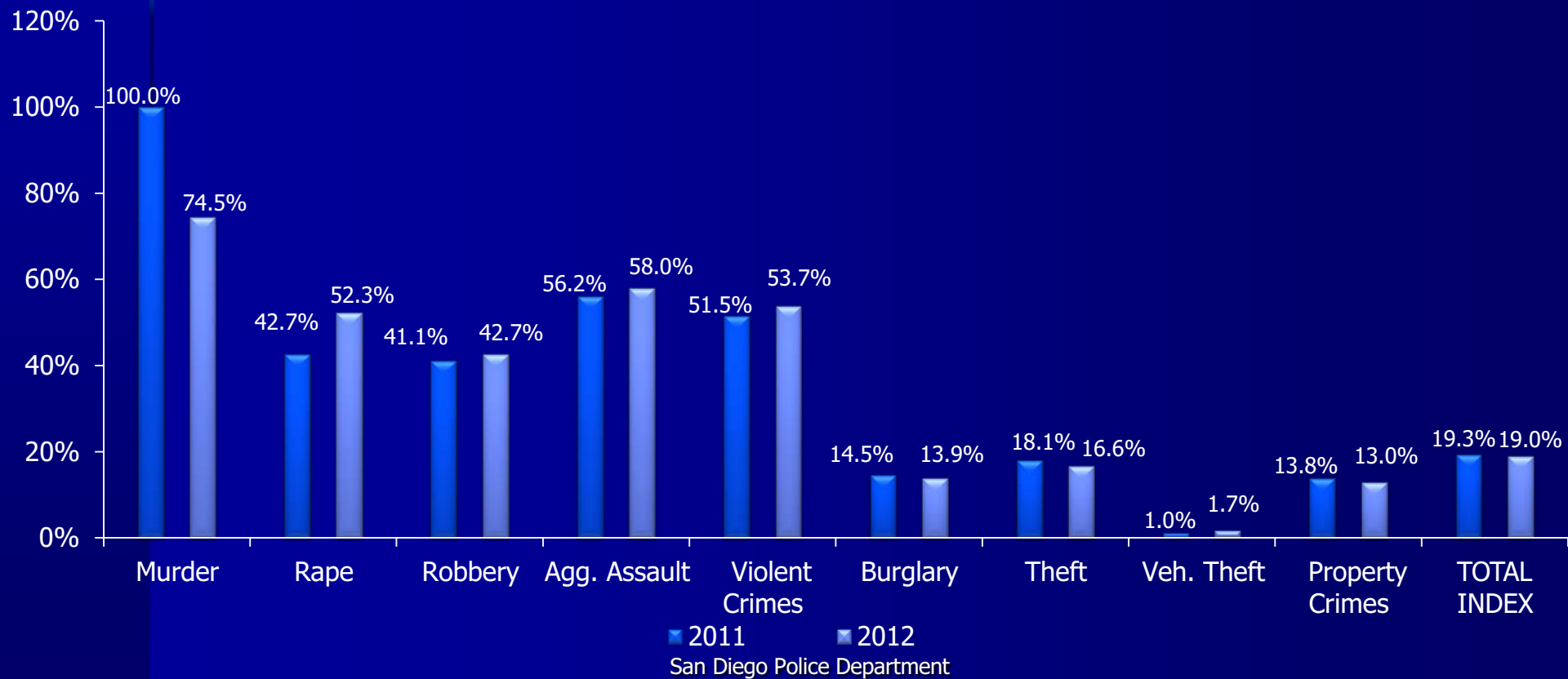
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# Crime Clearance Rates



- 53.7% of violent crimes were cleared in 2012.
- Murder case clearance rate was 74.5%.
- Property crimes clearance rate was 13.0%.
- Total index clearance rate of 19.0% in 2012 remained relatively unchanged from 2011.

# Other Crime Statistics

## Domestic Violence, Gangs & Hate Crimes



- The total number of domestic violence cases remained relatively constant in 2012, compared to 2011.
- Overall, gang crimes increased 13.4% and gang assaults increased 14.7%.
- Hate crimes decreased 16.7%.

# Juvenile Statistics



- The number of juvenile victims of violent crime decreased by 8% for 2012.
- There were fewer juvenile victims in each of the time categories; daytime had the largest decrease of 23.7%.
- Juvenile arrests showed a decrease in all time categories, with a total decrease of 29.1%.

# Response Times



- Incoming calls are dispatched according to a five step hierarchy ranging from the highest priority (Priority E) to lowest priority (Priority 4).
- Priority E, 3 and 4 calls showed slight decreases in response times, while Priority 1 and 2 call response increased.
- The response to Priority 2 calls had the largest increase of 4.4%.
- The number of dispatched calls decreased in all categories in 2012, except the number of priority E (6%) and priority 3 (1.7%) calls.

# Violence Reduction Efforts



- Use technology to enhance the Department's ability to identify and respond to crime patterns and predict crime.
  - Expand & train personnel on Crime View Dashboard.
  - Enhance customized crime analysis hot spot mapping & provide line level training.
  - Further develop the use of private video through Operation Secure San Diego.

# Violence Reduction Efforts



- Enhance personnel resources in focused areas to maximize impact (directed policing).
  - Develop divisional directed problem solving teams.
  - Expand the Tracking Known Offender (TKO) Program.
  - Provide proactive policing training to patrol officers.

# Violence Reduction Efforts



- Enhance personnel resources (cont.).
  - Enhance proactive patrol teams assigned to alcohol/entertainment areas.
  - Enhance Juvenile Services Teams (JST) to include extended hours.
  - Increase staffing for the Gang Suppression Team (GST).

# Violence Reduction Efforts



- Strengthen communication and partnerships with our communities.
  - Increase the use of social media as a communications tool.
  - Expand Crime Free Multi Housing Program.
  - Expand Neighborhood Watch.
  - Focus on homeless violence.
  - Enhance relationships with security and other non-law enforcement professionals.
