**DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY OF ITEM:**

This is an Information Item on the San Diego County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan.

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF ITEM BACKGROUND:**

The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (Public Law 106-390 October 30, 2000) requires all jurisdictions to have an approved hazard mitigation plan in place in order to qualify for hazard mitigation program grants and post disaster mitigation monies. The San Diego County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (HazMit) serves this purpose by identifying the most significant natural hazards and other manmade threats posed to the region, and also specifies goals, objectives, and actions to mitigate the impacts from such hazards for eighteen participating jurisdictions.

This original HazMit Plan was approved by the City Council in 2004 and the first revision was approved in 2009. This current draft is the second revision. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requires the HazMit Plan to be updated every five years. The City of San Diego element of the HazMit Plan includes goals, objectives, and action items, and is being provided to the Committee as an Information Item only.

The County of San Diego Office of Emergency Services (OES) is coordinating this second multi-jurisdictional revision which is projected to conclude in January, 2015. The City's Office of Homeland Security (OHS), working through the Chief Operating Officer, established a local planning group (LPG) from selected City departments to revise the document. The LPG was responsible for the development of the City's element of the HazMit Plan.

The departments in the LPG were selected as principal stakeholders in this effort due to their contribution to previous HazMit Plans, and because of the vital subject matter expertise they can provide. After reviewing the range of local hazards with the County and other multijurisdictional participants, the LPG identified the following hazard categories for the City of San Diego:

- Wildfire/Structural Fire
- Coastal Storms/Erosion/Tsunami
- Earthquakes

- Dam Failure
- Drought
- Extreme Heat
- Floods
- Hazardous Materials
- Landslide
- Terrorism
- Cyber Intrusion
- Other Manmade Hazards

The identified hazards include all previously listed hazards from the earlier plans, but have been updated in this revision to include drought, extreme heat and cyber intrusion to City networks.

The draft HazMit Plan will be submitted by the San Diego County Office of Emergency Services to the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) and FEMA in early 2015. Tentative FEMA approval is expected by June, 2015. Once tentative approval has been received from FEMA, the HazMit Plan will be submitted to the full Council for approval.
