PREPARATION OF: RESOLUTIONS ORDINANCE(S) AGREEMENT(S) DEED(S)

1. Authorize the Mayor and/or designee to execute, for and on behalf of the City of San Diego, a Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan (DWSRF) Loan, Funding Agreement, Amendments, Reimbursement Claims, Final Release Form, and take related actions for the 69th Street & Mohawk Pump Station Project.

2. Authorize the Mayor and/or designee to dedicate revenues from its Water Fund Rates, charges and assessments on parity with all other parity obligations of the Water Enterprise Fund in an amount sufficient to repay the DWSRF loan for the Project. This dedication shall remain in full force and effect until such Funding Agreements are fully discharged, unless modification or change of such dedication is approved by the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB.) If for any reason, said resources of revenue prove insufficient to satisfy the debt service of the DWSRF loan, sufficient funds shall be raised through increased water rates, user charges, or assessments or any other legal means available to meet this loan obligation and to operate and maintain this Project.

3. Authorize the City Engineer, or other registered engineer designated by the Mayor, to execute the Budget and Expenditure Summary, Claim Reimbursement and Certificate of Project Completion forms.

4. Authorize the City Engineer or other registered engineer designated by the Mayor to certify that the project is complete and ready for final inspection.

5. Authorize the Chief Financial Officer to apply for, accept, appropriate and expend up to \$18,800,000 in State Revolving Fund Loan funds for reimbursement to the Water Fund, contingent upon the City Comptroller certifying that the funds are available and contingent upon the loan being secured.

6. Authorize the \$18,800,000 loan to be repaid over 20 years at an interest rate that is 1/2 the most recent general obligation bond rate. The current Drinking Water SRF Loan rate is 1.663 percent.

DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY OF ITEM:

Authorization to enter into a low interest State Revolving Fund loan with the State Water Resources Control Board to fund the 69th Street & Mohawk Pump Station Project.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF ITEM BACKGROUND:

The Public Utilities Department will be submitting an application for construction to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB), Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) for the 69th Street & Mohawk Pump Station Project. The estimated total project cost for the project is \$18,800,000. The SWRCB will fund the full amount.

The DWSRF is a low interest loan program with a fixed rate. It provides public water systems in California the opportunity to utilize subsidized funding to correct infrastructure problems, to assess and protect source water, and to improve technical, managerial and financial capability. The current interest rate for the SRF loan borrowing of an eligible project is a low 1.663% for a 20-year term. Utilizing the SRF program for eligible projects results in significant debt service savings when compared to financing with 30-year fixed rate bonds. Also, SRF Loans are treated as "Parity Obligations" under the SRF Loan documents whereby SRF repayment will be on the same lien as the Water System's senior bond obligations. The City also dedicates net revenues of the Water Utility Fund for repayment of SRF financing on the 69th Street & Mohawk Pump Station Project, which is the same source of repayment for other outstanding parity, subordinate bond obligations, and outstanding SRF loans of the water system.

The 69th Street & Mohawk Pump Station Project will replace old pipelines and new pipelines that are proposed along Mohawk, 67th, 68th, and 69th Streets, El Cajon Boulevard, and College Grove Drive within both the College Area (Council District 9) and the Mid-City: Eastern Area (Council District 4). The project scope includes the replacement of the existing 69th and Mohawk Pump Station, installation of 1,300 linear feet of new pipeline, and replacement and upsizing of 5,460 linear feet of existing pipelines for a total length of 6,760 linear feet of new or replaced pipelines. The pipelines will be 4-8 feet deep with a trench width of approximately 2-4 feet.

The existing 69th and Mohawk Pump Station parcel is approximately 9,700 sq ft and will involve only light grading, as the site has previously been developed. Approximately 3,700 sq ft

of current impervious surface that will be removed and replaced with approximately 3,900 sq ft of impervious surface.

FISCAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The funding agreement, when issued for the 69th Street & Mohawk Project, will provide a loan up to \$18,800,000 to be repaid over 20 years at a 1.663 percent interest rate. This SRF Loan is to be repaid over 20 years at an interest rate that is ½ the most recent general obligation bond rate, the current Drinking Water SRF Loan rate is 1.663%. This rate could change depending on if the next bond sale occurs prior to the agreement being fully executed. Semiannual principal and interest payments will begin after project completion.

Based on the estimated loan amount of \$18,800,000, the annual debt service is expected to commence in FY17 for approximately \$95.6 thousand and ramp up to a total annual maximum of \$1.11 million for the next 20 years. The actual debt service impact would depend on the timing of the CIP execution. By entering into the SRF funding agreement, the Water Utility will covenant that each Fiscal Year the Net System Revenues will equal at least 120% of senior/parity debt service. Any potential impact on water rates from the proposed loan and the coverage requirements will be evaluated in the future Water Cost of Service Study.

Actions to be Taken Section:

1. The **Public Utilities Director** or designee is hereby authorized and directed to sign and file, for and on behalf of the **City of San Diego Public Utilities Department** a financial assistance application for a financing agreement from the State Water Resources Control Board for the Project;
2. The **Chief Operating Officer** or designee is hereby authorized to sign the DWSRF program financing agreement for the Project and any amendments thereto, and provide the assurances, certifications and commitments required therefore;
3. The **City Engineer** or designee is hereby authorized to represent the **City of San Diego Public Utilities Department** in carrying out the **City of San Diego Public Utilities Department's** responsibilities under the financing agreement, including approving and submitting disbursement requests (including Claims for Reimbursement) or other required documentation, compliance with applicable state and federal laws, and making any other necessary certifications;
4. The **City of San Diego Public Utilities Department** does hereby dedicate and pledge its net water revenues and its water enterprise fund to payment of the DWSRF financing for the Project. The **City of San Diego Public Utilities Department** commits to collecting such revenues and maintaining such fund(s) throughout the term of such financing and until the **City of San Diego Public Utilities Department** has satisfied its repayment obligation thereunder unless modification or change is approved in writing by the State Water Resources Control Board. So long as the financing agreement(s) are outstanding, the **City of San Diego Public Utilities Department** pledge hereunder shall constitute a lien in favor of the State Water Resources Control Board on the foregoing fund(s) and revenue(s) without any further action necessary. So long as the financing agreement(s) are outstanding, the **City of San Diego Public Utilities Department** commits to maintaining the fund(s) and revenue(s) at levels sufficient to meet its obligations under the financing agreement(s). If for any reason, the said source of revenues proves insufficient to satisfy the debt service of the DWSRF obligation, sufficient funds shall be raised through increased water rates, user charges, or assessments or any other legal means available to meet the DWSRF obligation and to operate and maintain the project.; and
5. The authority granted hereunder shall be deemed retroactive. All acts authorized hereunder and performed prior to the date of this Resolution are hereby ratified and affirmed. The State Water Resources Control Board is authorized to rely upon this Resolution until written notice to the contrary, executed by each of the undersigned, is received by the State Water Resources Control Board. The State Water Resources Control Board shall be entitled to act in reliance upon the matters contained herein, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the formation documents of the **City of San Diego Public Utilities Department** or in any other document.
