Approval request of a resolution authorizing the Mayor, the Chief Operating Officer, the Chief Financial Officer, the Office of Homeland Security Executive Director, and the Office of Homeland Security Program Manager to execute and file, for and on behalf of the City, applications and documents for the purpose of obtaining certain federal and state financial assistance for recovering costs associated with declared local emergencies. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF ITEM BACKGROUND:

The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services requires a resolution designating City officials under the Strong Mayor form of government, who are authorized to execute and file, for and on behalf of the City, applications and documents for the purpose of obtaining financial assistance to assist the City in recovering costs associated with a declared local emergency, caused by man-made or natural disasters. The financial assistance is then managed within the City by the Office of Homeland Security. This resolution updates and replaces Resolution No. R-309300 adopted November 25, 2014 which authorized designated City officials to execute and file, for and on behalf of the City, applications and documents for the purpose of obtaining certain federal financial assistance under Public Law 93-288, as amended by the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Assistance Act. This action is needed to update the Authorized Agents to include the Mayor, the Chief Operating Officer, the Chief Financial Officer, the Office of Homeland Security Executive Director, and the Office of Homeland Security Program Manager.
