DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY OF ITEM:

This is an informational report from the San Diego Police Department regarding the Tobacco and Electronic Cigarette Retailer Ordinance. Since November 2007, retail sellers of tobacco products have been police regulated. Retailers of tobacco products are required to obtain a police permit to operate in the City. In 2014, the SDMC was amended to regulate retail sellers of electronic cigarettes, electronic cigarette paraphernalia, and vaping juice, in the same manner that retail sellers of tobacco products are regulated, by requiring a police permit. Section 33.4519 of the SDMC requires the San Diego Police Department to report to the PS&LN on an annual basis, or as required.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

No Action Requested – Informational Only for PS&LN. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF ITEM BACKGROUND:

The City regulates retail business that sell tobacco products, tobacco paraphernalia, electronic cigarettes, electronic cigarette paraphernalia, and vaping juice by requiring police permits. The intent is to discourage violations of law prohibiting the sale or distribution of tobacco products and electronic cigarettes to minors to protect their health, welfare, and safety. Because of the increasing popularity of electronic cigarettes and the unknown health risks associated with their use, the City also regulates the sale of vaping juice, which is often packaged and marketed to attract youth. The costs of enforcing the regulations related to the retail sales of tobacco products and electronic cigarettes are borne by retailers who apply for and obtain police permits. Revenue generated by the application and permit fees are used to administer and enforce the regulations.

Part of the ordinance states that the San Diego Police Department will present a report to the committee on the status of the tobacco ordinance upon request.

Administration Information -

The San Diego Police Department has identified 1163 businesses that sell or distribute tobacco products in the City of San Diego, per the California State Board of Equalization 2015 reporting period. The Department has gained compliance from 1,116 of those businesses. The Department is verifying with the other 47 State Licensed business owners to confirm their current retail status and require compliance of those who are in fact selling tobacco and/or tobacco products.

Inspections/Enforcement -

The San Diego Police Department's Vice, Permits and Licensing Unit Officers conducted 121 overt field inspections during calendar year 2015. These inspections are used as an opportunity to educate, gain voluntary compliance and confirm prior noted deficiencies have been corrected by the business owners.

In addition to the overt inspections, the San Diego Police Department; Vice Permits and Licensing Unit Officers also conducted 17 covert (undercover) juvenile decoy operations in the City of San Diego. A total of 369 covert inspections were completed during these operations. All of these inspections were used to educate the business owners and cite those selling tobacco and/or tobacco products to a juvenile.

The 369 business locations inspected were both randomly selected by Council District and also selected in response to community complaints regarding the possible sale of tobacco products to juveniles. They include all types and sizes of stores (including Hookah Lounges and Vape Shops) selling tobacco products. All covert decoy operations were conducted during normal working hours and utilized vetted juvenile volunteers. No overtime compensation expenses were incurred. The operations resulted in 30 instances where tobacco products were sold to our minor decoy(s). Those 30 store operators were cited and released on their written promise to appear.

Estimated Illegal Sales Rate -

We conducted 369 undercover inspections that resulted in 28 violations for tobacco products and 2 violations for electronic cigarettes, electronic cigarette paraphernalia and/or vaping juice. The

overall total estimated rate of illegal sales to juveniles was 8% Citywide. This is a decline from calendar year 2014's 13.2% rate.

Fees and fines -

During calendar year 2015, the Police Department, Vice, Permits and Licensing Unit collected \$128,773 (Renewal) in regulatory fees and \$18,864 (New) in application fees for a total of \$147,637. This represents an increase of \$1,703 from calendar year 2014. All monies were sent to the City's general fund.

The San Diego Police Department; Vice Permits and Licensing Unit notifies, in writing, the owner of each business inspected during covert operations advising them of the inspection and whether they (their employee) complied with the law or not in selling to a juvenile. This practice has been greatly appreciated by the business owners and we are aware that some owners have enacted an employee reward policy when they receive notification that their business "passed" a covert inspection. And conversely, business owners notified of a failure are now on notice and expected to review their training policy as it applies to the sale of tobacco and/or tobacco products.
