Introduction of an Ordinance amending Chapter 9, Article 5, Division 1, of the San Diego Municipal Code by amending Section 95.0107; amending Chapter 12, Article 6, Division 2, by adding Section 126.0207; amending Chapter 12, Article 6, Division 4, by adding Section 126.0406; amending Chapter 12, Article 9, Division 7 by adding Sections 129.0731 and 129.0732; amending Chapter 12, Article 9, Division 8 by adding new Sections 129.0808 and 129.0809 and renumbering current Sections 129.0808, 129.0809, 129.0810, 129.0811, 129.0812, 129.0813, and 129.0814 to new Sections 129.0816, respectively; and amending Chapter 14, Article 2, Division 12, by amending Section 142.1210, all relating to signs.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION:

City Council action is requested to amend Chapters 9, 12, and 14 of the San Diego Municipal Code (SDMC) relating to signs. These minor changes will update the sign regulations contained in the SDMC based on recent First Amendment case law, furthering the goals of the sign regulations, including traffic safety and the aesthetic character of the City. The first change will add several safeguards to sign permit procedures. These safeguards will require the City to approve or deny an application for a sign-related permit within a definite period of time. The safeguards will also refer to state law allowing expedited judicial review of permit decisions affecting First Amendment protections. The second change affirms the SDMC's content neutrality by allowing the owner of an otherwise legal sign to substitute non-commercial speech for commercial or other non-commercial speech.
