AUDIT COMMITTEE'S RECOMMENDATION:

On 6/23/2008, Audit voted 3 to 0 to accept the report and direct the Independent Budget Analyst to initiate scheduling before the City Council. (Councilmembers Faulconer, Atkins, and Young voted yea.)

SUPPORTING INFORMATION:

On June 3, 2008, voters approved Proposition C which, in part, provided new City Charter language to address the responsibilities and composition of the City's Audit Committee. New language in City Charter Section 39.1 calls for a reconfigured Audit Committee comprised of two members of the City Council (one to serve as Chair of the Committee) and three public members. On June 23, 2008, the current Audit Committee received Report #08-67 from the IBA suggesting a process for implementing the provisions of Proposition C.

The City Clerk expects the new voter approved City Charter language to become effective in mid July. In order to implement new City Charter Section 39.1 as it relates to a reconfigured Audit Committee, it will be necessary for the City Council to establish a Screening Committee as described in Proposition C. The Screening Committee is charged with vetting the qualifications of public member Audit Committee candidates and recommending a pool of at least two candidates (for each of three new public member positions) for the City Council to consider for appointment.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION: (Continued)

The Screening Committee is to be comprised of “a member of the City Council, the CFO, the IBA, and two outside financial experts appointed by the other three members of the Screening Committee and confirmed by the City Council.”

In order to implement the Audit Committee provisions of Proposition C, the first step is for the City Council to adopt a resolution appointing a member of the City Council to serve on the Screening Committee. The Council President will have requested nominations from the City Council for this appointment prior to the scheduled Council meeting. Once the City Council has confirmed their Screening Committee appointee, the IBA anticipates the outside financial experts will be recommended and docketed for confirmation by the City Council on July 28th.

The IBA has suggested that the Screening Committee be established before the legislative summer recess to allow for candidate solicitation, review of qualifications and final recommendation of public member Audit Committee candidates for City Council consideration in September 2008. This resolution would initiate the process for establishing the Screening Committee described in Proposition C and represent the first step in reconfiguring the City’s Audit Committee.

FISCAL CONSIDERATIONS: None.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Martinez Ranch Road is a two-lane local street approximately 375 feet in length, lying between Bristow Court and Britannia Court within the Martinez Ranch Business Park, within the Otay Mesa Community Plan Area. The Martinez Ranch Business Park was subdivided according to Map No. 12488 (filed with the County Recorder November 11, 1989). A portion of Martinez Ranch Road was recently completed; surrounding property is undeveloped, though mass grading for Lots 2 and 5 of Martinez Ranch Business Park is underway.

The developer of the Martinez Ranch Business Park, Capella Development, has submitted the application for the street name change in tribute to Mr. Robert Hixson, a long-time member of the Otay Mesa business community and currently the chair of the Otay Mesa Planning Committee. A petition seeking support of the street name change was approved by 100 percent of the affected property owners. The proposal meets all criteria outlined under Council Policy 600-12.

All costs associated with the processing of this project are recovered from a deposit account maintained by the applicant.

A valid appeal must be filed with the City Clerk no later than 2:00 p.m., 10 calendar days from the date of this Notice stating briefly which of the above findings made by the City Engineer was improper or incorrect and the basis for that conclusion.
