





WHEREAS, there has been an increase in alcohol-related criminal activities, noise, violence, and dangerous, aggressive and/or offensive conduct related to the excessive use and abuse of alcohol at beach areas throughout the City of San Diego;

WHEREAS, on Labor Day 2007, an alcohol-induced melee occurred in Pacific Beach which necessitated San Diego police in riot gear to arrest sixteen people in order to restore the public peace;

WHEREAS, many citizens of the City of San Diego fear to take their families to the beach areas because of drunk and disorderly conduct;

WHEREAS, it has been the experience of other coastal communities that prohibition of alcohol at their beaches results in a decrease in violence and undesirable behavior;

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this ordinance to prohibit the consumption of alcoholic beverages at all public beaches, bays, coastal parks, and coastal access, view point, and bluff rights-of-way, in addition to prohibiting and limiting alcohol consumption at certain public parks; NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 5, Article 6, Division 0 of the San Diego Municipal Code [SDMC] is amended by amending section 56.54 to read as follows:

§ 56.54 **Alcoholic Beverage Consumption Prohibited in Certain Areas**

An ordinance to amend Chapter 5, Article 6 of the San Diego Municipal Code by amending section 56.54, titled "Alcohol Beverage Consumption Prohibited in Certain Areas" to add a ban on alcohol consumption at all public beaches, bays, coastal parks, and coastal rights-of-way on the Memorial Day, Fourth of July, and Labor Day Holiday periods. This ordinance also repeals sections 56.70, 56.71, and 56.72, all relating to the Fourth of July keg ban.

This ordinance contains a notice that a full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to its passage, a written copy having been available to the City Council and the public prior to the day of passage.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.

WHEREAS, alcohol-related criminal activities and excessive noise, violence, and dangerous, aggressive and/or offensive conduct related to the excessive use and abuse of alcohol at beach areas are known to increase in the summer months, and especially on the Memorial Day, Fourth of July, and Labor Day holidays;

WHEREAS, on Labor Day 2007, an alcohol-induced melee occurred in Pacific Beach which necessitated San Diego police in riot gear to arrest sixteen people in order to restore the public peace;

WHEREAS, many citizens of the City of San Diego fear to take their families to the beach areas because of drunk and disorderly conduct;

WHEREAS, it has been the experience of other coastal communities that prohibition of alcohol at their beaches results in a decrease in violence and undesirable behavior; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this ordinance to prohibit the consumption of alcoholic beverages at all public beaches, bays, coastal parks, and coastal access, view point, and bluff rights-of-way on the Memorial Day, Fourth of July, and Labor Day Holiday periods, in addition to prohibiting and limiting alcohol consumption at certain public parks and beaches throughout the year; NOW, THEREFORE

WHEREAS, on Labor Day 2007, an alcohol-induced melee occurred in Pacific Beach which necessitated San Diego police in riot gear to arrest sixteen people in order to restore the public peace;

WHEREAS, many citizens of the City of San Diego fear to take their families to the beach areas because of drunk and disorderly conduct;

WHEREAS, it has been the experience of other coastal communities that prohibition of alcohol at their beaches results in a decrease in violence and undesirable behavior;

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this ordinance to prohibit the consumption of alcoholic beverages at all public beaches, bays, and coastal access, view point, and bluff rights-of-way, and all coastal parks in Council District Two (all coastal parks south of Tourmaline Surfing Park), in addition to prohibiting and limiting alcohol consumption at certain public parks; NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 5, Article 6, Division 0 of the San Diego Municipal Code [SDMC] is amended by amending section 56.54 to read as follows:

I want my 13-year-old, and the rest of my family, to be able to safely enjoy his community, and all it has to offer. The actions of drunks on the beach are not something I want him to see, much less participate in. I fear him being hit by a drunk driver while riding his bike. Will the city take responsibility for that? Our neighbor, a 45-year resident, recently was mowed down in broad daylight on his way to Ace Hardware by a drunk college student leaving a beach party. He was in a coma for days, and still is having memory problems, residual leg/hip pain (it was broken in 2 places) and shoulder pain (smashed collar bone and arm).

I am a 30-year resident of Mission and Pacific Beach communities, and no longer enjoy my beaches and parks. This is in large part because of irresponsible, wanton behavior by inebriated people who come to our community for the express purpose of partying. Mission Beach, in particular, and (more recently) Pacific Beach have always had their share of quirky individuals, parties, and rowdiness, but in recent years out-of-control behavior, lack of respect, common decency even, for residents, and the environment has escalated to an intolerable point.

Additionally, the idea that the beach areas are a free-for-all has extended into the quiet neighborhoods of Crown Point and North PB.
