SUBJECT : Appointments and Reappointments to the Citizens' Equal Opportunity Commission

It is my pleasure to appoint Dr. Patricia Hsieh, Alden Salcedo, Jonathan Schneeweiss, and Dr. Shirley Weber and reappoint Brad Barnum, Eileen Chaske, Rebecca Llewellyn, James McManus, Dan Salas, and Dr. Sarah Young to the Citizens' Equal Opportunity Commission, subject to your confirmation.

Patricia Hsieh, Ed.D is the President of San Diego Miramar College and serves as the Chief Executive Officer of the main campus and two off-site locations. As President and CEO, Dr. Hsieh oversees more than 12,000 students, 500 personnel, and a \$35 million annual budget, and provides leadership in the areas of instruction, student services and general administration. She also plays a key role in the development of partnerships with industry groups, businesses, and educational institutions to enhance and increase opportunities for the college. As an administrator in a California community college system, Dr. Hsieh is also actively engaged in promoting and strengthening diversity in all aspects of the college. From hiring staff, promoting contracting opportunities, and working with various industries and associations, Dr. Hsieh is committed to serving the needs of a very diverse community college. On behalf of Miramar College, Dr. Hsieh led the effort and played a key role in the passage of Proposition N, a \$870 million bond measure which was the catalyst in moving forward with the College's Facilities Master Plan. This measure resulted in multiple construction and renovation contract opportunities for minority and small businesses.

Dr. Hsieh has a long history of academic, business, and civic involvement. She currently serves on the Mabuhay Alliance Advisory Board and San Diego North Chamber of Commerce Board. She was recently nominated to serve on the Asian Business Association Board of Directors. She is also a member of the San Diego Chinese Women's Association and the Poway Chamber of Commerce. In 1990, Dr. Hsieh was awarded a doctorate degree in Institutional Management in Higher Education with a concentration in Community College Administration from Pepperdine University. She also received a Masters of Arts Degree in Guidance and Counseling from Wayne State

University in 1990. Dr. Hsieh resides in Scripps Ranch and will replace Audie De Castro, who has resigned, for a term expiring January 1, 2008.

Alden Salcedo is the Director of Business Operations and Senior Consultant for R3 Partners, a company that specializes in cost-effective customized business solutions including management, technology, and integration. He also serves as Adjunct Faculty for the University of Phoenix, and guest lecturer for the University of San Diego's Corporate and Professional Education Program. Throughout his career, Mr. Salcedo has provided program management and organizational leadership, resource management, staff development and performance improvement, and administration of contracts and procurement. In his previous role as a Principal Contracting Officer, Mr. Salcedo oversaw compliance and administration of cost effective procurement of a wide range of commercial goods and services valued at over \$7 million annually. Previously, Mr. Salcedo was the Director of Supply Logistics & Fiscal Management for the Naval Inshore Undersea Warfare Group ONE for three years, and Director of Logistics and Supply Programs for the Naval Reserve Readiness Command, Region 19. Mr. Salcedo was awarded a Bachelor's Degree in International Security from the U.S. Naval Academy, a Master's Degree in Logistics Management from National University, and a Masters of Business Administration from the University of Redlands, Whitehead Center.

Mr. Salcedo has received numerous civic awards and acknowledgements for his contributions to the community, along with awards while serving in the Navy including the President of the United States Meritorious Service Medal, and Secretary of Navy Commendation and Achievement Medals. Mr. Salcedo's business and community involvement includes service on the Board of Directors for the Mabuhay Alliance, Aguinaldo Foundation, and the Philippine American Business Improvement District. Mr. Salcedo was nominated by Councilmember Young and resides in Scripps Ranch. He will replace Julia Legaspi, who has resigned, for a term expiring January 1, 2009.

Jonathan Schneeweiss is a Partner/Principal Shareholder of the Law Offices of Jonathan Schneeweiss where he advises clients on real estate development and serves as a liaison between developers and local, state, and federal agencies. In addition to his law practice, Mr. Schneeweiss is an award-winning Broker Sales Associate for Coldwell Banker Residential Brokerage managing all aspects of real estate including marketing, sales, and client development. Previously, Mr. Schneeweiss was Senior Deputy County Counsel for the San Diego Office of County Counsel and an Associate at Luce, Forward, Hamilton & Scripps, LLP. From 1996-1999, Mr. Schneeweiss served as a Lieutenant for the United States Navy Judge Advocate General's (JAG) Corps. He was rated among the top two JAG Corps Attorneys in 1998 and was a prosecution and criminal defense Trial Attorney. In addition, he was selected as Special Counsel to the Commander-in-Chief, U.S. Atlantic Fleet and oversaw litigation on a Base and Realignment Closure Case. From 1995-1996, Mr. Schneeweiss was Assistant Counsel for the United States Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.

Among Mr. Schneeweiss' many professional and civic activities, he is currently the President of the Tom Homman Law Association, a San Diego-based Bar Association dedicated to the advancement of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender issues throughout California and the nation. He is also a member of the San Diego County Bar Association, United Jewish Federation, and a UCSD Extension Adjunct Professor. Mr. Schneeweiss was awarded his Juris Doctor Degree in 1994 from Syracuse University College of Law, and a Master of Laws Degree (LL.M.) in Environmental Law from George Washington University National Law Center in 1996. Mr. Schneeweiss resides in Ocean Beach and will replace Sharon Marshall, who has resigned, for a term expiring January 1, 2008.

Shirley Weber, Ph.D. is a Professor of Africana Studies at San Diego State University where she has dynamically and actively engaged and motivated students since 1972. Her break-through educational initiatives and numerous achievements as an educator, administrator, lecturer, talk show host, writer and advocate have touched the lives of many throughout the San Diego region and across the country. Due to Dr. Weber's leadership and development of the Africana Studies department, the department was recognized as one of the best undergraduate departments in the country. In addition, Dr. Weber's interest and great ability to impact the educational community led to her successful election to the San Diego City Schools Board of Education from 1988-1996. She is also active as the Executive Director of the Association of African-American Educators, and Director of San Diego State University's Academy for Effectively Teaching African American Students. She has written numerous articles, publications, and papers that have ranged from diversity in the classroom, the achievement gap, Black studies, gender, race, class, culture, communicating to diverse communities, and women's studies.

Dr. Weber also has a distinguished record of community and public service, and has been recognized by local, state, and national entities for her outstanding contributions and efforts to be a change agent within the educational, social, and political arenas, and the African-American community. Dr. Weber's currently serves on the Board of Directors for NAACP and the Women's Hall of Fame. She is the recipient of numerous professional, humanitarian, and civic awards from organizations including the NAACP, Urban League, National Council for Black Studies, and San Diego State University. Dr. Weber was awarded Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral degrees in Speech Communications from the University of California, Los Angeles. Dr. Weber resides in Oak Park, and will replace Reverend Arthur Cribbs, who has resigned, for a term expiring January 1, 2009.

WHEREAS, the San Diego City Council adopted an ordinance, codified at San Diego Municipal Code section 26.16, establishing the Citizens Equal Opportunity Commission; and

WHEREAS, section 26.16 provides that the Commission monitor and/or evaluate the City's Equal Opportunity Program; advise the Mayor, City Council, Civil Service Commission and other appropriate agencies; submit written quarterly reports for review by the City Council's Rules Committee and City Council; assist in recruiting competent, historically under-represented minorities, women and disabled to compete for City positions; and promote the City of San Diego as an Equal Opportunity Employer of individuals and firms desiring to contract with the City; and

WHEREAS, the ordinance provides that the Commission shall consist of 11 members appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council; and
